 - Tribal consultation meetings
 - 2015 National Content Test
- 2020 Census two questions (OMB 1997)
 - Is Person 1 of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin?
 - What is Person 1's race?



Planning

- Report to Congress by March 31, 2017
 - subjects planned for 2020 Census
- Federal Register Notice, February 8, 2018
 - Final 2020 Census Residence Criteria and Residence Situations
- Report to Congress by March 31, 2018
 - Question wording
- <u>Federal Register Notice</u>, May 1, 2018
 - Final Content Design for the Prototype 2020 Census Redistricting Data File.



Operations

- Local Update of Census Addresses, 2017 2019
- Address Canvassing, 2019
- Field Operations
 - Group quarters outreach February 2019
 - Internet, mail, phone response began March 2019
 - COVID-19 pandemic
 - Transitory locations delayed to September
 - Non-response follow-up scheduled to end July 26th; postponed to October 15th



Operations

- Field Operations: <u>Self-response</u>
 - National self-response rate 67.0%
 - Oregon 2020 self-response rate 69.2%
 - (internet 57.4%)
 - Oregon 2010 self-response 66.9%



Operations

- Field Operations: Non-response follow-up (NRFU)
 - Repeat visits; phone
 - Administrative records
 - Proxy interviews (neighbors)
 - Household composition probability (imputation)
 - Re-interviews and verification
- Final response rate "99.98 percent"
 - Census Bureau, October 19, 2020



Reporting: Personal Data Confidentiality

- Disclosure Avoidance: "The use of Differential Privacy in protecting respondent data leads to the need to balance statistical accuracy with privacy loss."
 - Census Bureau web page, Statistical Safeguards
- Invariant at these levels of geography and higher:
 - Total population (at the state level)
 - Total housing units (at the census block level)
 - Number of group quarters facilities by type (at the census block level)



Reporting: Apportionment

- We ... plan to deliver a complete and accurate state population count for apportionment in early 2021, as close to the statutory deadline as possible.
 - Census Bureau, December 30, 2020
- The earliest date the apportionment numbers will be ready is March 6... as the Census Bureau fixes anomalies discovered during data processing, Department of Justice attorneys said Monday during a court hearing.
 - AP News January 11, 2021



Reporting: Redistricting Data

- Public Law 94-171 requires that the redistricting data be delivered to state officials within one year of Census Day or no later than April 1, 2021.
- As close to April 1, 2021, as possible: By this date, the Census Bureau will send redistricting counts to the states. This information is used to redraw legislative districts based on population changes.
