## **SUMMARY**

Requires law enforcement officer assigned to work crowd management to have their first initial and last name, and unique agency identifier, if any, affixed to the front of their uniform, have their first initial and last name, or a unique identifier assigned by their law enforcement agency, affixed to the back of their uniform, if wearing a tactical helmet and assigned a unique identifier by their law enforcement agency, have their unique identifier affixed to the back of their helmet, have the word "POLICE", "SHERIFF" or "TROOPER" clearly visible from the front and back of their uniform, and have their law enforcement agency patch affixed to their shoulders. Requires those elements be affixed in a clearly visible manner. Requires law enforcement agencies to adopt policies that prohibit obscuring any of this information. If practical, safe, and tactically feasible, requires law enforcement officer to provide their name and identification number, or unique agency identifier, when requested by a member of the public. Provides process for member of public to request the name of a law enforcement based on a complete or partial badge or other number, subject to certain exceptions.

Becomes operative 90 days after passage.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - **SECTION 1.** (1) A law enforcement officer who is on duty and assigned to work crowd management shall:
  - (a) Have their first initial and last name, and a unique identifier assigned by their law enforcement agency, if any, affixed to the front of their uniform;
  - (b) Have their first initial and last name, or a unique identifier assigned by their law enforcement agency, affixed to the back of their uniform;
  - (c) If wearing a tactical helmet and assigned a unique identifier by their law enforcement agency, have their unique identifier affixed to the back of their helmet in a clearly;
  - (d) Have the name of the law enforcement agency jurisdiction and the word "POLICE", "SHERIFF" or "TROOPER" on the front and back of their uniform; and

- (2) The elements required by subsection (1) of this section shall be affixed in a manner that makes them clearly visible. Law enforcement agencies shall adopt policies prohibiting the intentional obscuring by a law enforcement officer of any of the identification described this section.
- SECTION 2. (1) If practical, safe, and tactically feasible, a law enforcement officer shall provide their name and identification number, or a unique identifier assigned by their law enforcement agency, when requested by a member of the public. An officer may provide an agency-produced business card to the member of the public to satisfy this requirement.
- (2) Upon request from a member of the public and receipt of any of the following information concerning a law enforcement officer, a law enforcement agency shall perform an evaluation and analysis to identify the officer based on:
  - (a) A partial name of an officer;

- (b) The full or partial badge number or other identifying number of an officer;
- (c) A photograph of an officer;
- (d) A full or partial license plate or other identifying number of a police vehicle;
- 17 (e) A physical description of an officer; or
  - (f) The location, date and time in which an officer was present.
  - (3) Within seven days after receiving a request described in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the law enforcement agency shall confirm to the requester receipt of the request.
  - (4) Within 14 days after receiving a request described in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the law enforcement agency shall provide the requester with:
  - (a) The name of the law enforcement officer and their number assigned by the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training; or
    - (b) An explanation of why the identification could not be performed.
  - (5) Notwithstanding subsection (4) of this subsection, and within 14 days after receiving a request, a law enforcement agency must provide a requester with the name of the officer when a full badge number is provided to the agency.
  - (6) The requirements of this section do not apply to a law enforcement officer who is participating in one or more undercover law enforcement operations.
    - **SECTION 3.** As used in Sections 1 and 2 of this 2021 Act:

1	(1) "Law enforcement agency" means the Oregon State Police, a county sheriff's
2	office, a municipal police department, or a police department established by a university
3	under ORS 352.121 or 353.125.
4	(2) "Law enforcement officer" means a member of the Oregon State Police, a sheriff
5	or deputy sheriff, a municipal police officer, or an authorized police officer of a police
6	department established by a university under ORS 352.121 or 353.125.
7	SECTION 4. (1) Sections 1 to 3 of this 2021 Act become operative 90 days after its
8	passage.
9	SECTION 5. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the
10	public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes
11	effect on its passage.
