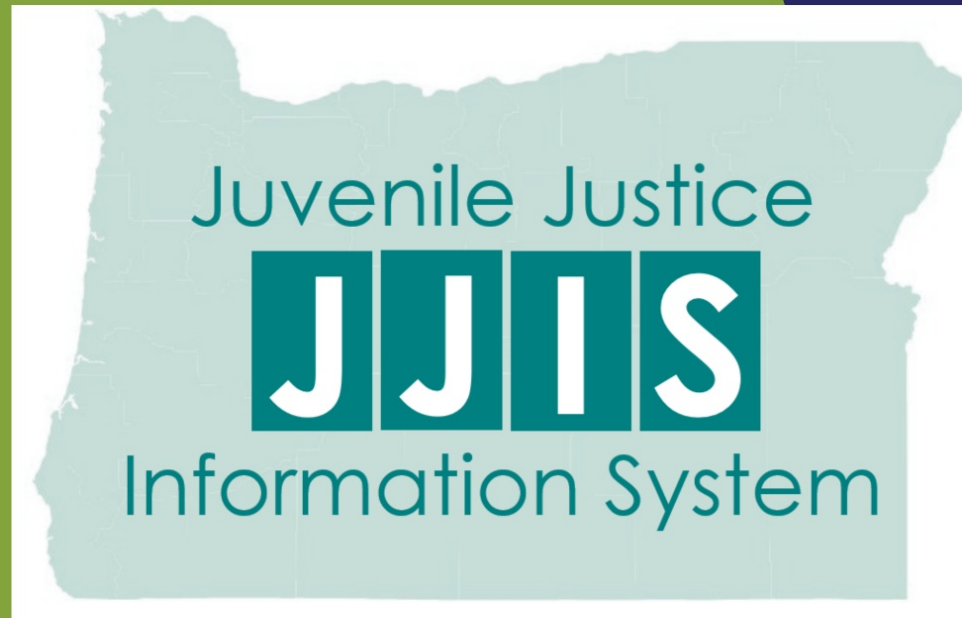


SB 1008 - Juvenile Sentencing Reform
