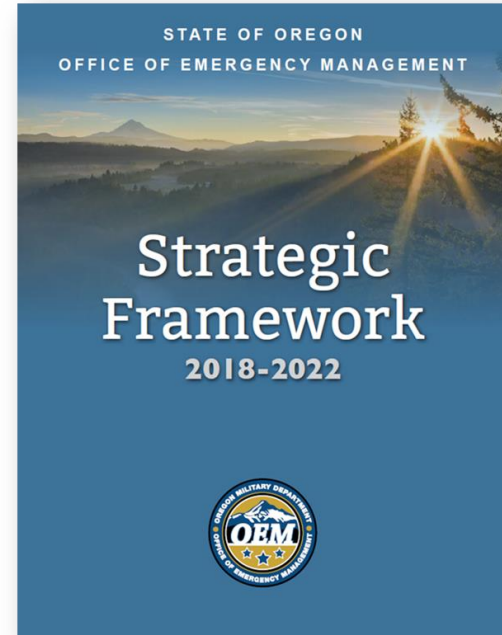

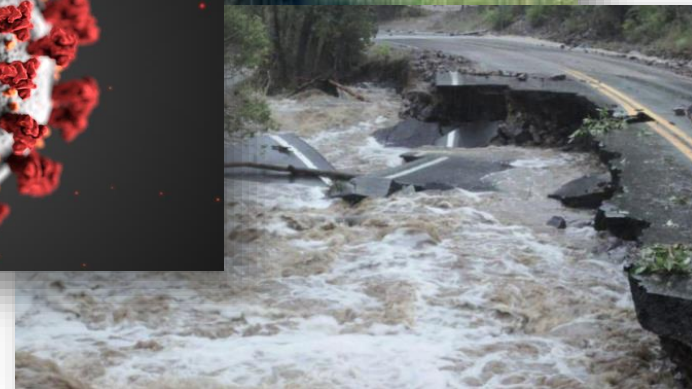
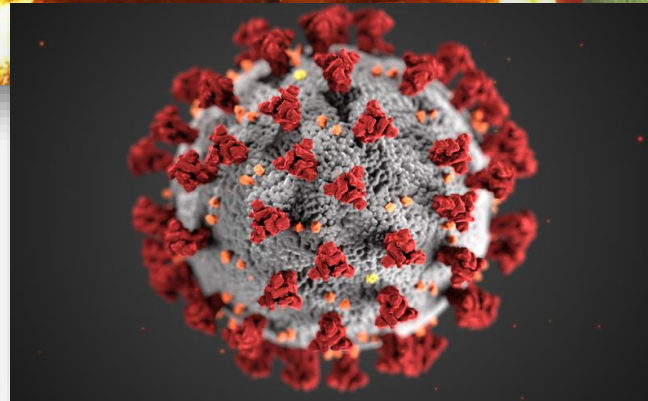


What's the Worst That Could Happen?

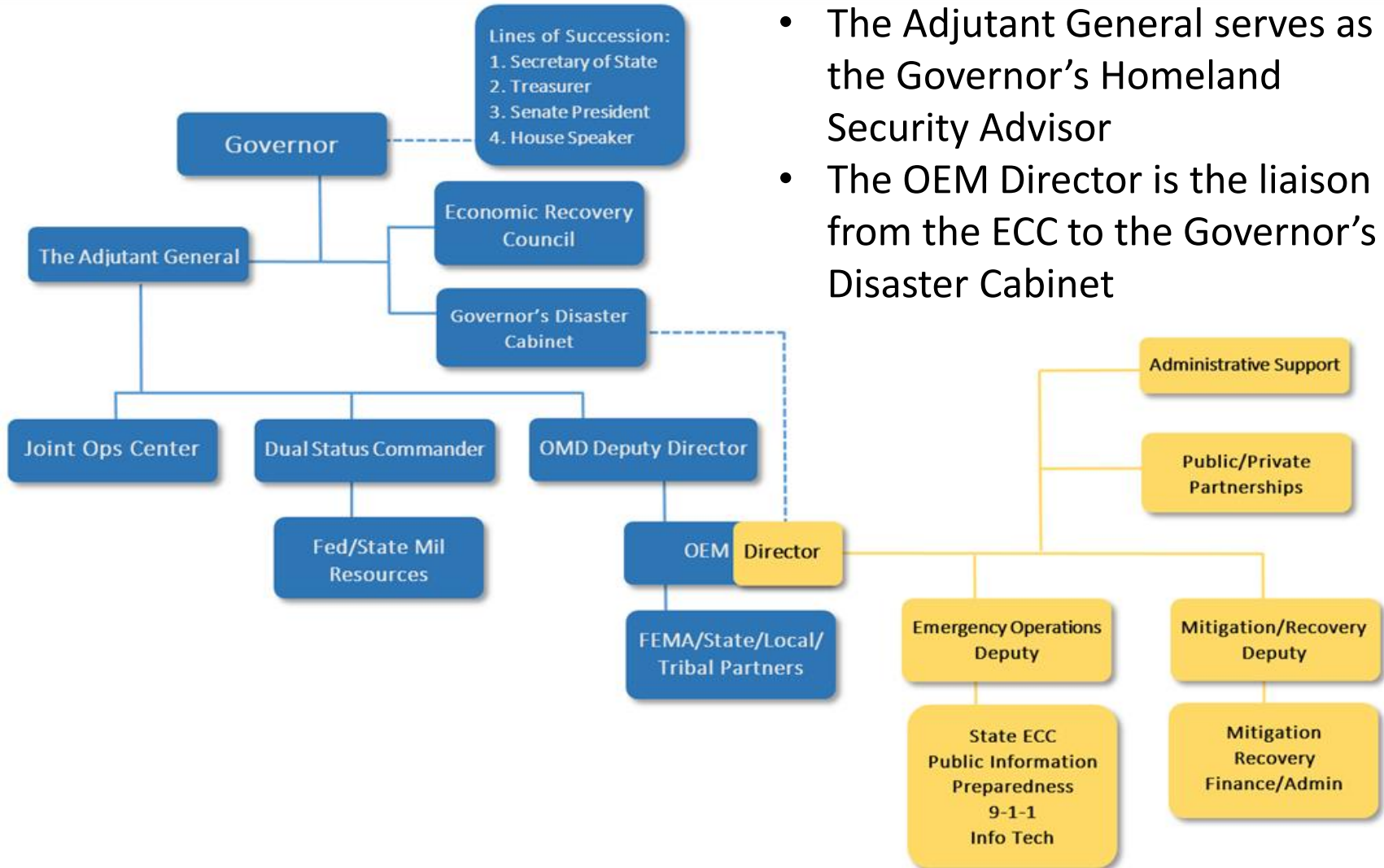
Emergency Management Functions

State Emergency Management Structure



- The Adjutant General serves as the Governor's Homeland Security Advisor
- The OEM Director is the liaison from the ECC to the Governor's Disaster Cabinet



Emergency Management Structures

- ORS 401 and authorities
 - 401.032 places responsibility “at the local level”
- Local Emergency Management
 - Counties must, cities may
 - Different structures and capacity state-wide
- Tribal
 - Government to government relationship
 - Relationships with counties, the state, and federal agencies
- State OEM
 - Serves as the coordinating agency for state response through State Emergency Coordination Center (State ECC)
 - Connection to local and federal response
 - Subject Matter Expertise, Guidance and support
 - Grant management

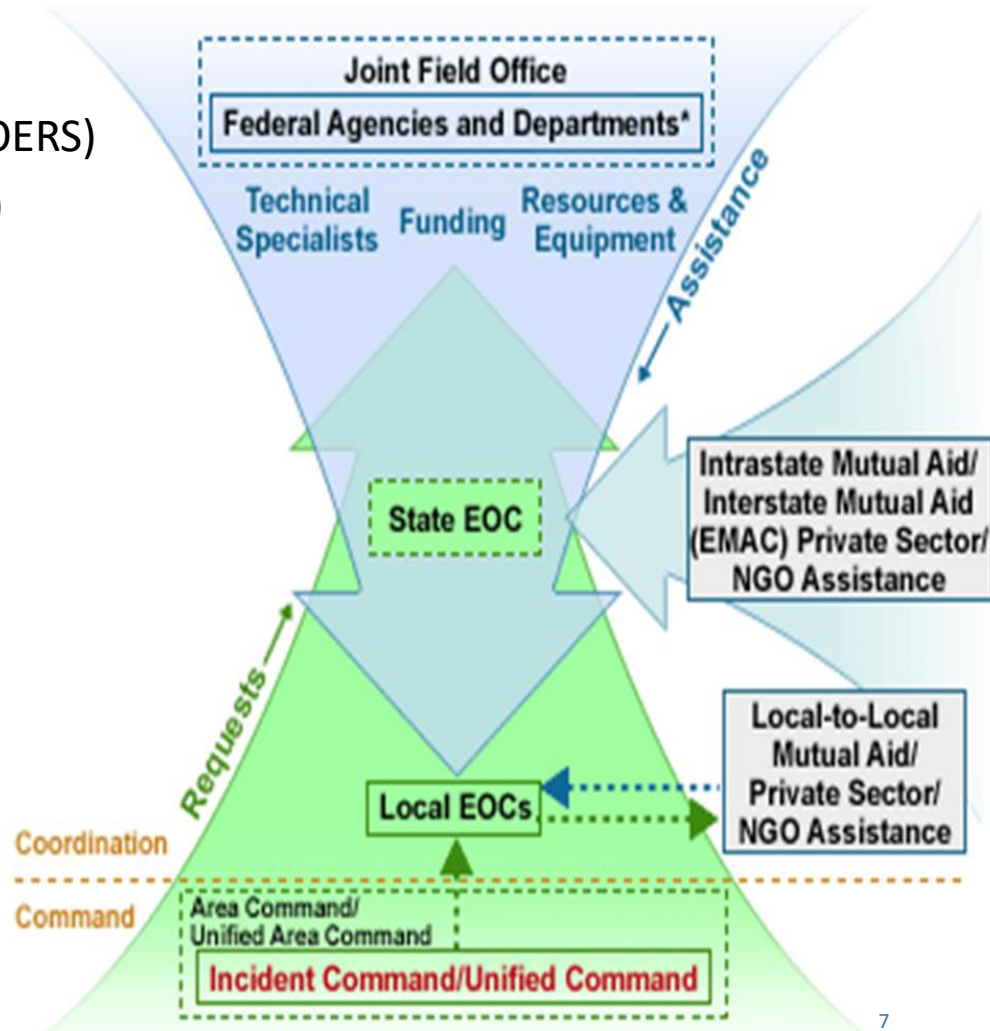

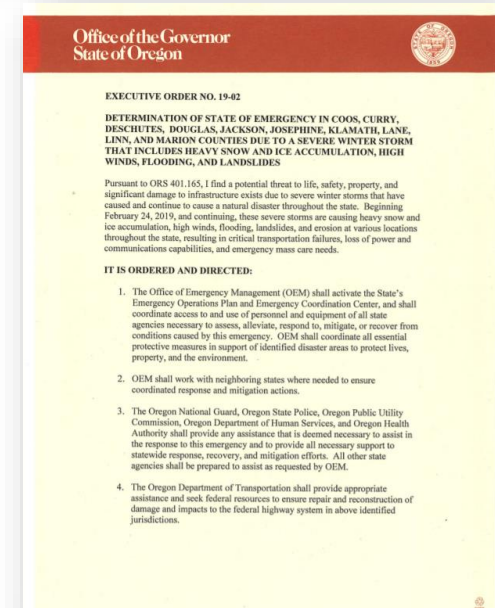

- Local declarations
 - City Council
 - County Commission/Court
- State Declarations
 - Emergency Dec (ORS 401.165)
 - At the request of a county/ determination an emergency exists/imminent
 - Suspension of Agency Rules (401.168)
 - Additional Powers/Assumption of Control (401.175)
 - Conflagration (ORS 476.510)
 - Other emergency authorities
 - Drought (ORS 536.740)
 - Public Health (ORS 433.441)
 - Abnormal Disruption of Market (ORS 401.965)
 - Federal Assistance
