# **Responding to Community Need**







We serve over 52,000 patients in Washington and Yamhill counties at:

- Five primary care and six dental clinics in Newberg, McMinnville, Beaverton, Hillsboro and Cornelius
- Five school-based health centers located in Willamina, Tigard,, Century, Beaverton and Forest Grove
- A mobile outreach clinic (medical/dental) to serve migrant camps, nurseries, community events, CV19 testing, etc.

### Our patients

- Speak over 60 different languages
- •40% of our patients are under 18
- ■56% of our patients are of Hispanic descent
- ■60% are covered by Medicaid
- ■20% are uninsured

## **COVID-19** Response

- 11,463 Tested
- 1,838 Positive
- Positivity Rate 19.44%
- Hispanic % of Total Screen: 61.21%
- Hispanic % of Total Positive: 83.51%
- VG in partnership with local health departments has supported community engagement (testing, education, and outreach activities)
- Gearing up for vaccines, 80% of staff vaccinated with 1<sup>st</sup> Dose








### **Total Cost of Care**









#### 3. What is driving the trend? PMPM cost is driven by changes in price & utilization.
