PMHNP: What Are They?

- Psychiatric/Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP): The PMHNP independently provides health care to clients with mental and emotional needs and/or disorders. Their scope or practice may be further differentiated by care of populations newborn to young adulthood, adolescent to adult, or across the lifespan
- Registered Nurse.
- MSN: Advanced education in pharmacology, pathophysiology, & physical assessment.
- National certification according to patient population.
- Prescriptive authority.

PMHNP: Supply Issues

- Only 1 PMHNP educational program in Oregon (OHSU)
 - 16 seats in Portland (may decrease to 12-14 due to lack of available clinical sites).
 - 8 seats total in La Grande, Ashland, Klamath Falls campuses
 - Currently reviewing 15 student applications for distance program.
 Financing an issue for these students.
- Currently 279 NP students of out-of-state programs working with preceptors in Oregon, 59 of which are PMHNP students.
