Dear Mr. Gabliks:

We have completed a risk assessment of the firearms management policies and procedures at the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (department). Our objective was to identify significant control risk areas by gaining an understanding of the department's policies and procedures.

To meet this objective we obtained updated information from department management on policies and procedures and reviewed documentation supporting implementation of key controls over firearms management.

Results

Based on our review, we did not identify any significant control risk areas. Department management is currently in the final stages of implementing a new inventory management system. Once the system is in place, the department plans to update related policies and procedures. Proper documentation of this system, including written policies and procedures, is an important step in ensuring firearms are appropriately managed.

The purpose of this letter is solely to describe the scope of our review and the results of the procedures performed. Because this was a limited review, we were not required to and did not follow generally accepted government auditing standards.

We appreciate the time, effort and cooperation of department staff. The professionalism we encountered and openness to suggestions have made this a collaborative process. Prioritize each program activity for the Agency as a whole

1. Criminal Justice Training is ranked as the first agency-wide priority. The program's purpose is to provide essential public safety training. Training classes include Basic Police, Basic Local Corrections, and Basic Parole and Probation.

2. Criminal Justice Standards and Certification is ranked as the second agency-wide priority. The program certifies public safety officers and monitors ongoing compliance with standards. It also revokes certification when necessary.

3. Fire Training and Certification is ranked as the third agency-wide priority. The program provides essential fire training and implements standards for certification of firefighters.

4. Other Training Programs include Telecommunications/EMD Training, Traffic Safety Training, Campus Public Safety Training and OLCC Training. These programs are ranked as the fourth agency wide
