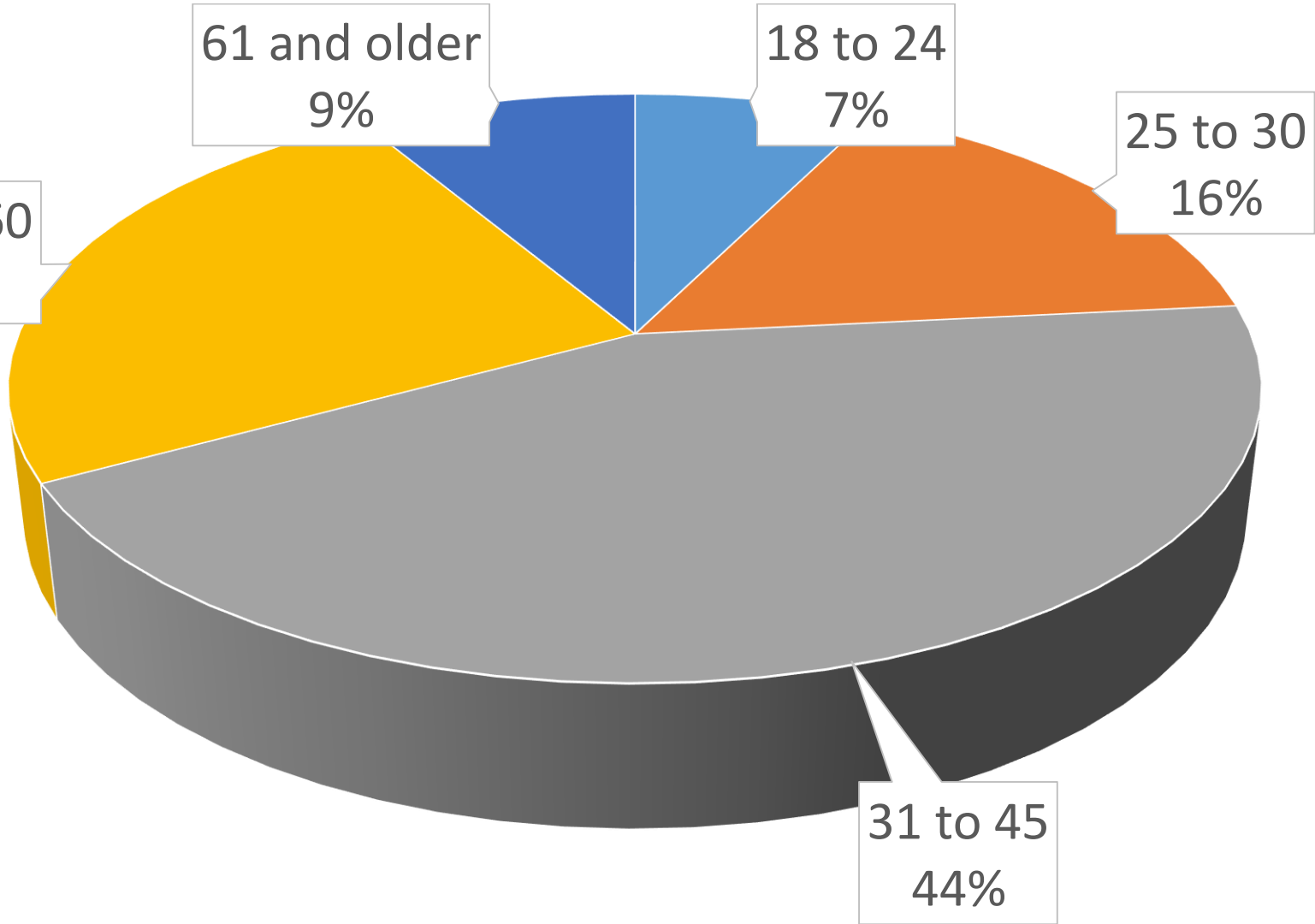

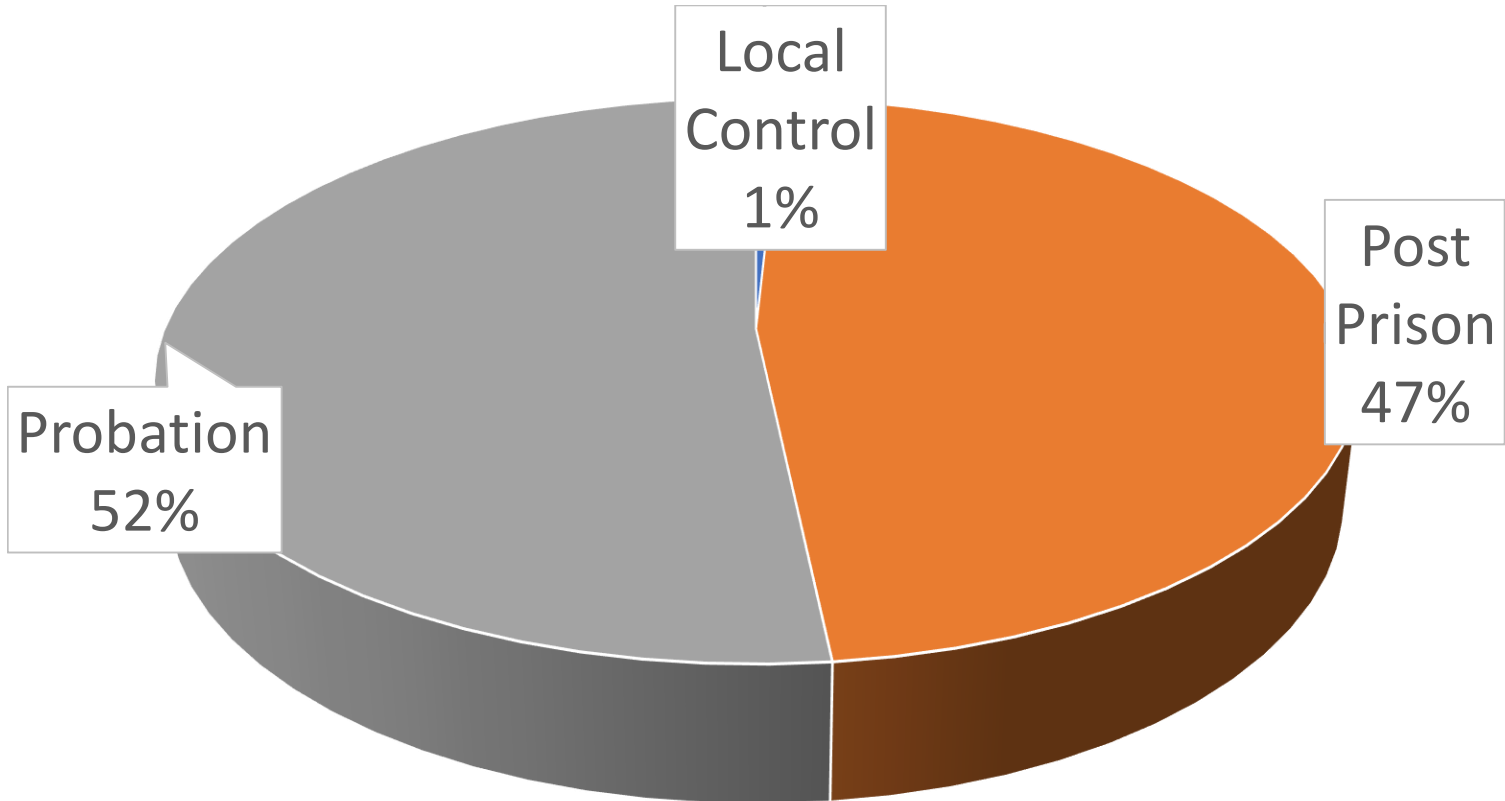
RE-ENTRY AND RELEASE

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- Statewide program responsible for preparing individualized release plans that include community-based services and resources at release
- Assists releasing AICs to apply for state and federal benefits and obtain state-issued identification, when eligible
- Provides transition classes and guidance on effective re-entry to work, family and community life
- Provides staff support to the Governor's Re-Entry Council
