

## **HB 2239 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY**

#### **WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Defines veteran for purposes of this provision. Requires each judicial district to provide any veteran charged with a crime access to a court program specifically designed to address the needs of veterans. Provides that upon successful completion of any veterans' court program the court may consider a defendant's motion for dismissal of the charges.

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

#### **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Oregon revised statute 3.450 governs the implementation of specialty court programs that provide individualized treatment for substance abuse issues. The program requires an individual to report regularly and provide progress updates to court. The program provides a local drug court team, consisting of the court, agency personnel and treatment and service providers who assist in supervising program participants. Some jurisdictions have expanded treatment courts to provide specialty programs tailored towards veterans who have been charged with a crime. These programs may provide access to alternative sentencing opportunities to veterans whose substance abuse issues or mental health needs and demonstrate a nexus between their military service and criminal charges.

HB 2239 would require all judicial districts to provide access to a specialty veterans' court program to eligible veterans.
