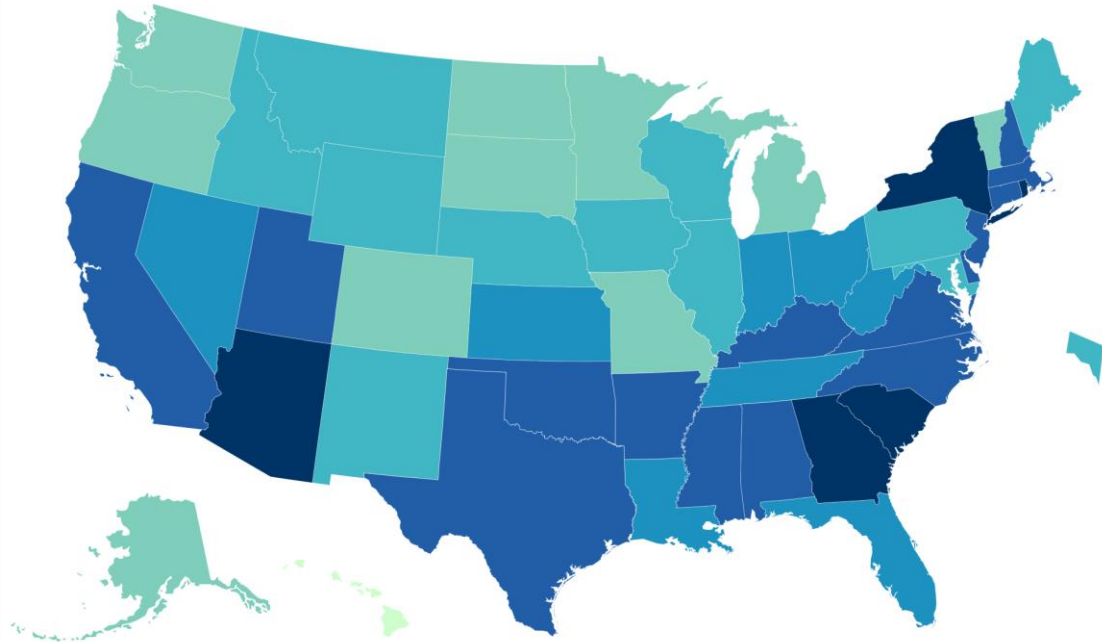

### Cases

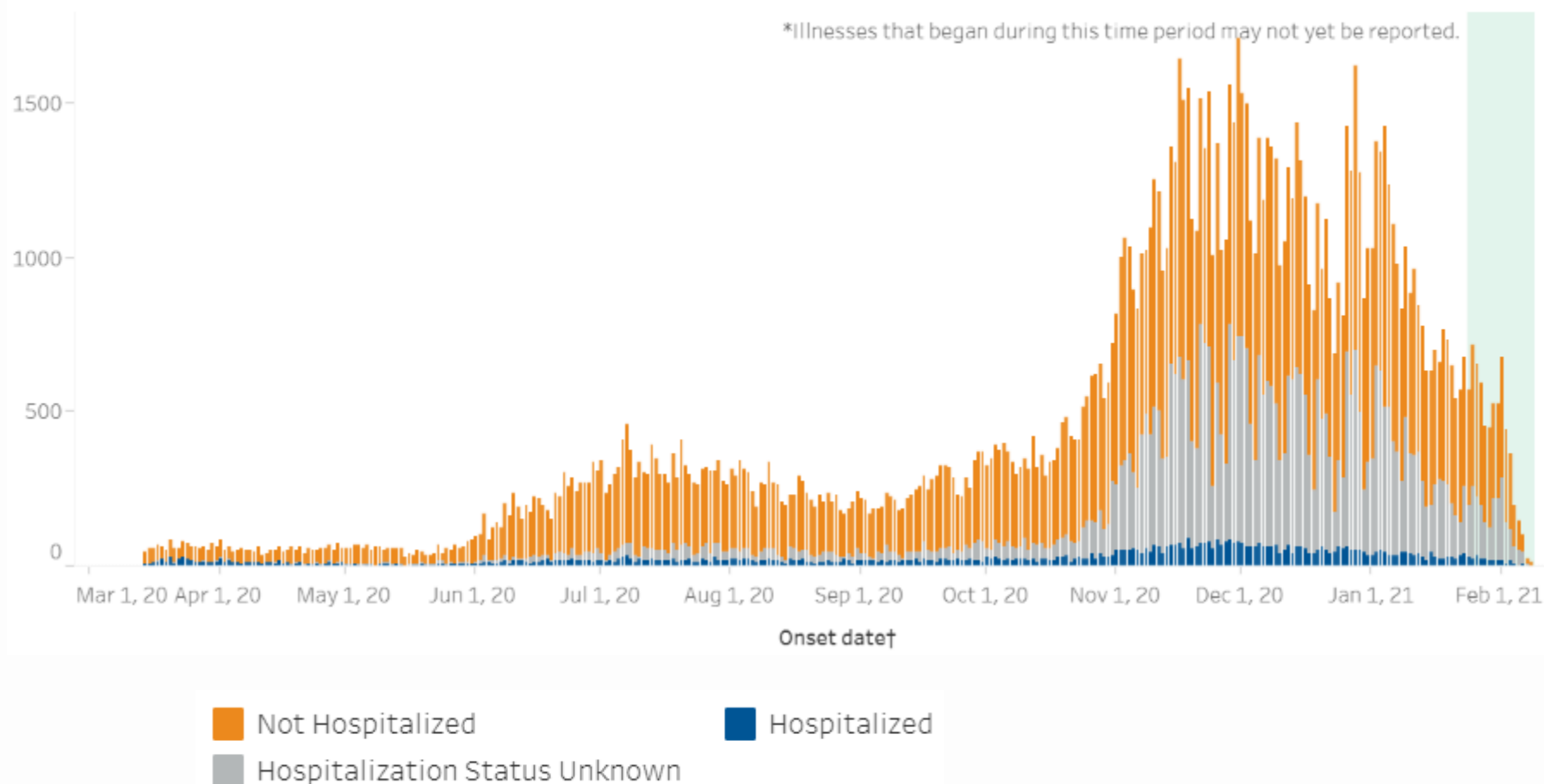
Total	147,392

### Deaths

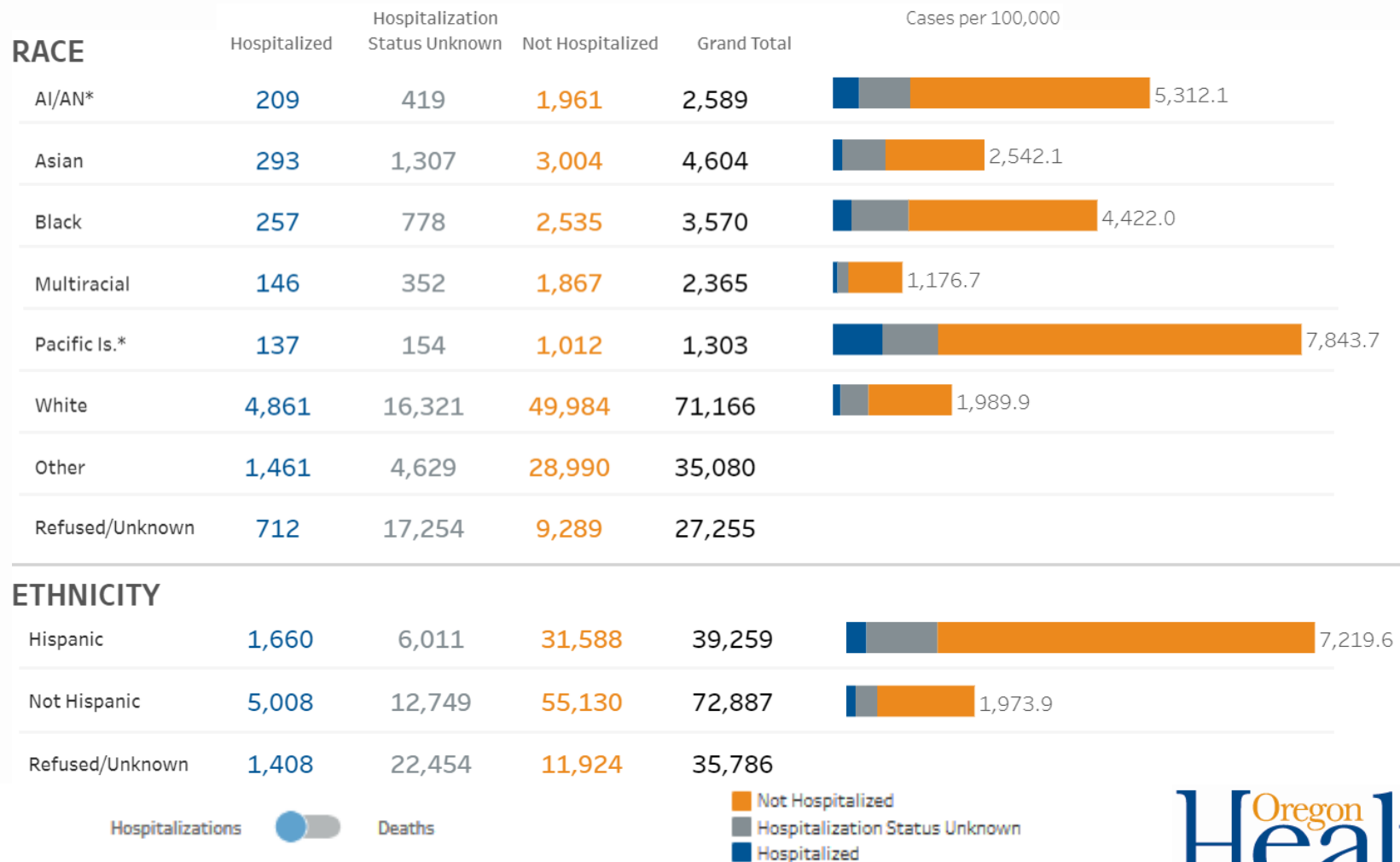
Total	2,031

# Oregon's Epi Curve

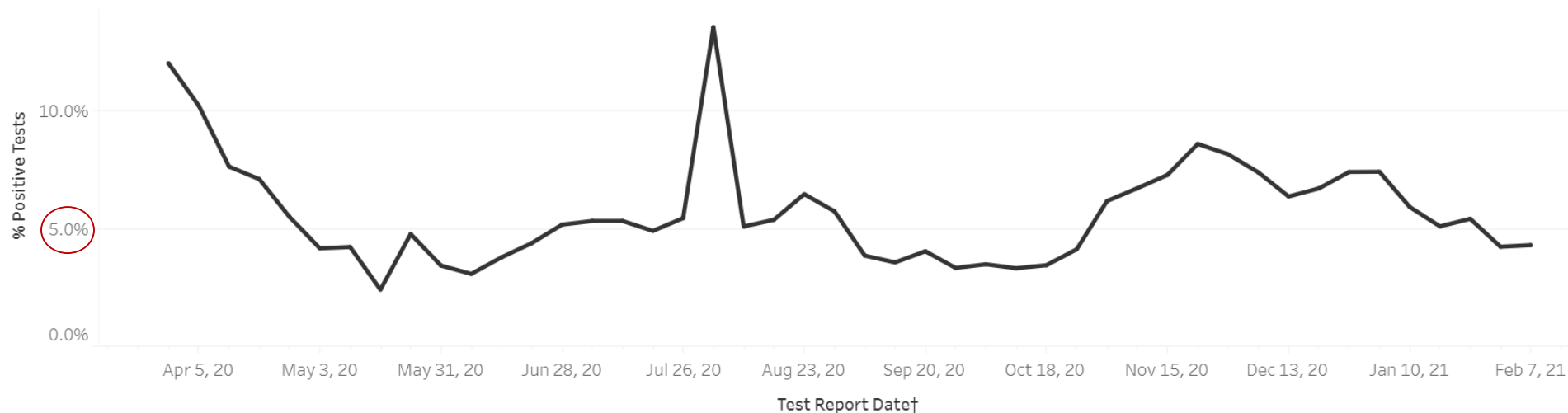


# Oregon Hospitalizations by Race and Ethnicity

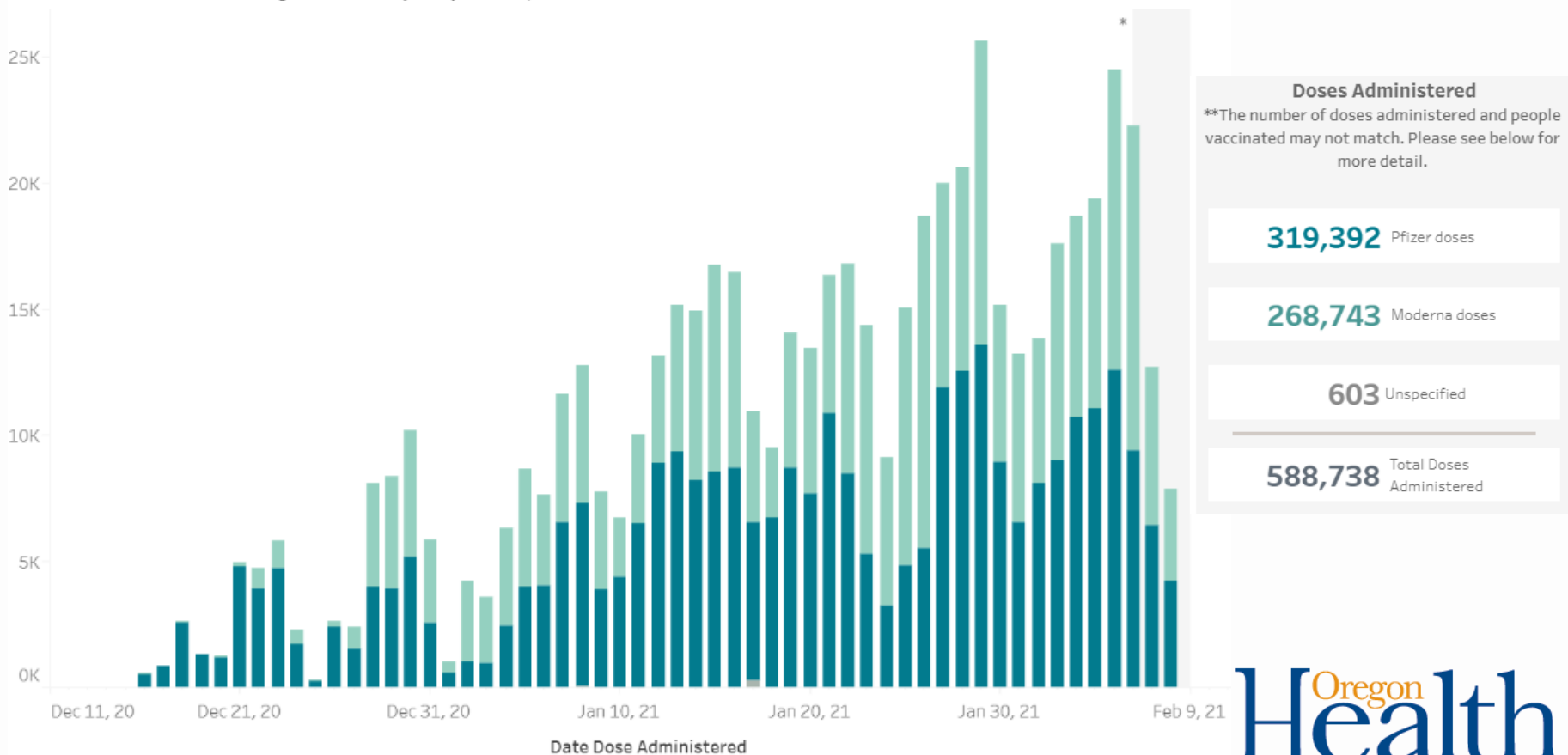

# Upcoming Allocations

## Week of Feb 8 allocations

- This will include dose allocations for:
  - Seniors age 80 and older: 20,000 1st doses
  - Educators/Early Learning: 11,500 1st doses
  - Follow-up 1A populations: 13,000 1st doses
  - Adults in Custody: 5,000 1st doses
  - Tribal populations: 3,000 1st doses

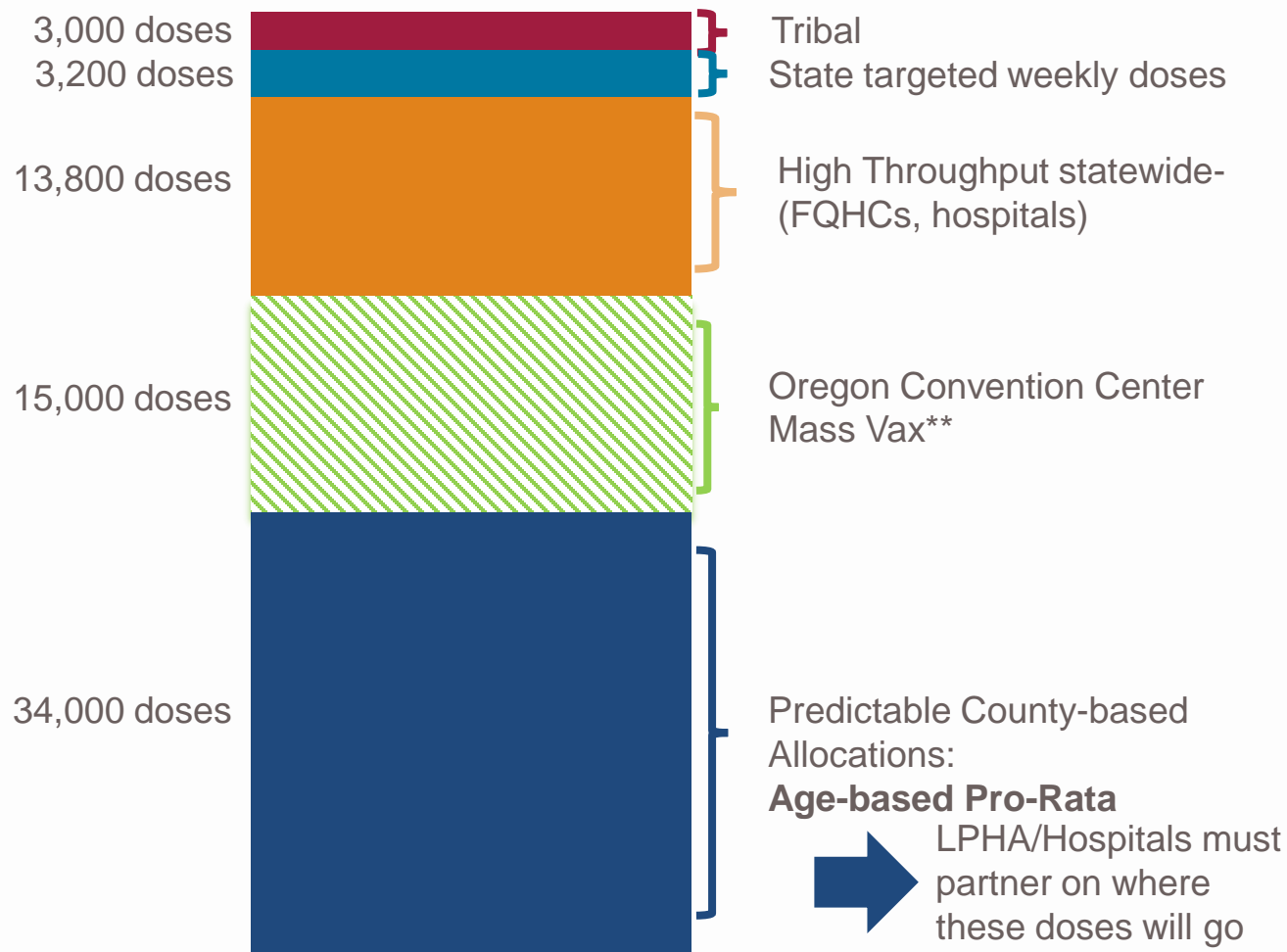
## Future weeks allocation

- Moving towards a predictable allocation based on county senior populations
  - Potential additional equity-based factors to be considered

# New Strategies for Reaching Communities of Color

- FQHC distribution
  - Additional federal allotment to FQHC\*
- Targeted retail pharmacy distribution
- Targeted allocations
- Re-sequencing with added vaccine

# Predictable Allocation Plan and Equity Focus



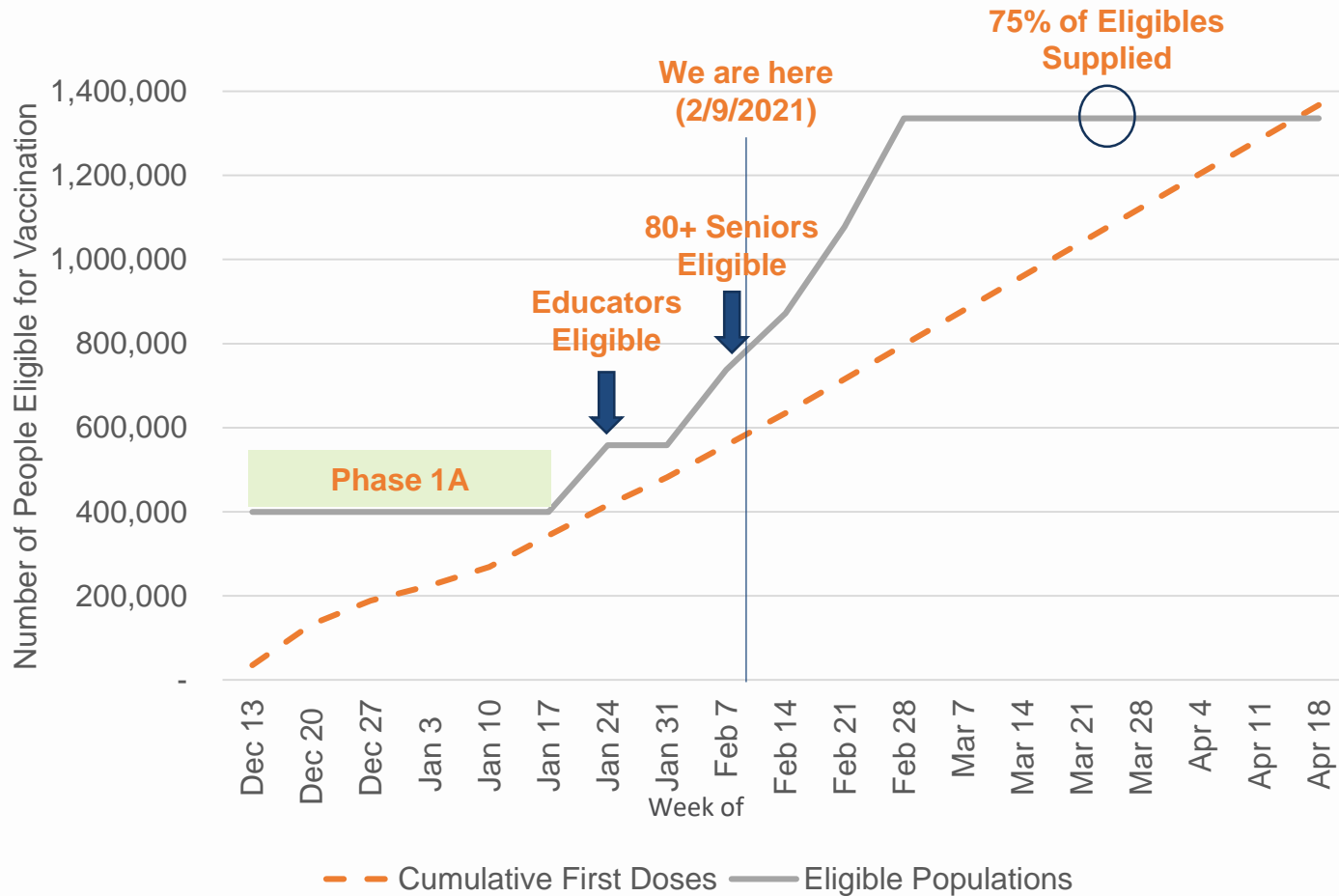

# More Consistent Weekly Allocation

- Support Nine FQHCs (4,200 doses)
  - Virginia Garcia sites, Yakima Valley Farmworkers-Woodburn, NE Portland, East Multnomah County, Hood River, Medford, Malheur, Morrow, Umatilla
  - If more federal supply—increase doses
- Provide consistent weekly support to Hospital based Mass Vax sites (23,500 doses)
  - Oregon Convention Center (Tri-County Hospital partnership)-15,000 doses
  - Deschutes County (St. Charles and LPHA)-1,000 doses
  - Lane County Fairgrounds-1,500 doses
  - Southern Oregon site (FEMA run with Asante)-1,000 doses
  - Samaritan Hospitals in Benton, Linn, Lincoln—1,100 doses
- Provide county specific totals based on pro rata of 65+ population
  - 49,000 doses spread to all Oregon counties weekly
- Continue Government to Government commitment to Oregon's tribes
  - 3,000 doses each week
