Prevailing rates in the context of Oregon incomes

- The average hourly rate (weighted by job hours) for the example affordable housing project in Portland was \$39.15 per hour using 2021 statewide average PWR for all zones in Oregon
- The annual equivalent full time pay for \$39.15 per hour is \$81,100
- Hourly prevailing wages were calculated using the most conservative assumptions, and did not include additional zone differential distance pay, or overtime hours
- The 2019 median household income income in Oregon is \$67,058
- A worker earning \$81,000 a year would be in the 84th percentile statewide
