The Nature of Guardianships and Conservatorships

- ► Tension between leading the life we choose and maintaining our independence versus having another person make decisions for us
- Terminology Guardian and Conservator; Respondent/Protected Person
- Presumptions of competency of adults; no such presumption for minors

Capacity

- How do we decide if someone has capacity
- Capacity..... for what?
- Determination of capacity in guardianship cases includes evidence of the Respondent's medical condition, functional ability and cognitive ability - not merely a diagnoses

Protective Proceedings by the Numbers

As of February 14, 2021:

- ▶ 14,252 pending protective proceeding cases statewide
- Pending cases by type:

Adult protected persons - 66%

Minor protected persons - 30%

Pending cases by subtype:

Guardianships - 70%

Conservatorships - 13%

Guardianship/Conservatorship - 15%

By the Numbers (continued)

Pending protective proceeding cases by years since filing:

Less than one year: 12%

One to five years: 35%

Five to 10 years: 24%

Ten years and older: 29%

Assets of protected persons under conservatorships: Estimated \$1.8 billion owned by protected persons

Demographics

- Population of Oregon approximately 4.2 million people
- Percentage of Oregon population:
 - ▶ 65 and older: 18.2% (766,080 people)
 - ▶ 60 and older: 24.62% (1,038,317 people)
 - ▶ 50 and older: 36.83% (1,553,279 people)

Demographics of Oregon by Judicial District

Life of a Guardianship/Conservatorship Case

- Petition to begin the case (ORS 125.055)
- Notice and time to object (ORS 125.060, 125.065, 125.070)
- Court Visitor appointed (ORS 125.150)
 - Mandatory for adult guardianship petition, certain minor guardianships and all temporary guardianships
 - Discretionary for all other protective proceedings
 - ► Independent investigation, qualified, training
- Objections by Respondent and others (ORS 125.075)
 - Respondent in writing or orally
 - Others in writing and filed

Life of a Guard/Cons Case (cont)

- Court appointed counsel for the Respondent (ORS 125.025(3)(b))
- The hearing
 - Petitioner has the burden of proof
 - Clear and Convincing standard
- Court determination: Dismissal or Limited Judgment (ORS 125.300, ORS 125.400)
- Continued duties of the guardian and conservator
- Continued Court oversight and monitoring

Temporary Guardianships and Conservatorships

- Emergency circumstances
- Appointment for a specific purpose and not to exceed 30 days (ORS125.600(3))
- Additional elements (ORS 125.600(1) and 125.600(2))
- Procedures and protections (ORS 125.605)
 - Court visitor
 - Court appointed attorney
 - ► Hearing within 2 judicial days of objection
 - Court may require hearing
