


Oregon State Police Firearms Instant Check System (FICS) General Comparisons between 2019/2020 and current backlog

COMMON REASONS FOR DELAYED/PENDING

- Possible NCIC/LEDS "near hit" based upon name, date of birth and/or social security number in any of the databases accessed during firearm transaction review.
 - This means the name, DOB and SSN# typed into the transaction "near hits" on a person throughout the United States
 - Near hits happen even if firearm purchaser does not have a criminal history
 - Near hits must be reviewed by OSP FICS Staff before approval or denial decision can be made.
- "Near Hits" are one of the more common reasons for a pending status.

COMMON REASONS FOR DELAYED/PENDING

- Identification issues
 - Gun purchaser must provide valid and current Government issued identification
 - Address listed on firearm application must match address on ODL or Government issued identification.
 - Expired and/or suspended ODL's are not valid per Federal and State Laws.
 - ATF was contacted at the start of COVID and OSP FICS was informed valid and current identification must be presented.
 - FFL dealer enters incorrect information
 - Incorrect name, DOB, address,
 - This could cause the transaction to be cancelled or delayed while follow up investigation is completed.

COMMON REASONS FOR DELAYED/PENDING

- Gun purchaser has a criminal history somewhere in the United States and the criminal history disposition is not updated.
 - OSP FICS required to conduct research to determine if a State/Federal prohibitor exists on the gun buyer.
 - One of the more common reasons for delay/pend.
 - Length of delay on receiving dispositions throughout the United States can take days and up to months.
 - Requests sent to LE Agencies, DA's and Courts.
- Possible hits on firearm serial number Follow up required to verify firearm is not stolen

As of February 15, 2021 the FICS backlog are as follows

- 6968 Web Que Backlog (Oldest transaction is 1/26/21
- 3107 Research not started (Oldest transaction is 9/19/20)
- 2701 Research started
- 2692 Emails waiting to be reviewed and attached to transactions
- 400 Challenge Calls ready to be returned
- 3431 Challenger Calls that need to be transcribed into FICUS
