# SB 428 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Extends the timeline to submit a report by the Task Force on Universal Health Care from the 2021 legislative session to the 2022 regular session. Declares emergency, takes effect on passage.

## **BACKGROUND:**

In 2019, the Oregon Legislative Assembly passed Senate Bill 770, establishing the Task Force on Universal Health Care. The Task Force is charged with recommending a universal health care system that offers equitable, affordable, comprehensive, high quality, publicly funded health care to all Oregon residents. The Task Force began meeting monthly in July 2020, and will submit a report to the Legislature recommending a Health Care for All Oregon Plan no later than June 2021.

The Task Force's recommendations must address:

- Eligibility, covered benefits, and affordability
- Role of the current health care system
- Provider reimbursement and participation
- Cost containment
- Financing of and revenue to support universal coverage
- Governance and administration of a universal health care model

The Task Force is also assessing employer-sponsored coverage, publicly financed coverage programs (e.g., Medicare and Medicaid), and feasibility of federal waivers. The Task Force has established several advisory and technical committees, which report back to the Task Force monthly and are responsible for proposing Plan design elements (see list above) to be considered by the full Task Force in drafting its recommendations. Per Senate Bill 770, the Task Force also created the Consumer Advisory Committee to provide input from a health care consumer perspective.

Senate Bill 428 extends the Task Force on Universal Health Care to the 2022 regular session.
