WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Modifies start date for calculating one-year duration of certain protective orders if court continues or modifies order more than 30 days after original order date.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

No amendment.

BACKGROUND:

Oregon statutes provide several distinct categories of protections orders for individuals meeting certain qualifying risk factors and/or circumstances. Once granted, these orders impose restrictions on contact between the petitioner and an identified respondent, including, an Elderly Persons and Persons with Disabilities Abuse Prevention Act (EPPDAPA) Restraining Orders or Family Abuse Prevention Act (FAPA) Restraining Orders. Once granted, typically these protection orders remain in effect for one year from the date of issuance unless terminated.
