OMMP TRACKING

- Required grow sites growing for 3 or more cardholders to track inventory and transfers in the Cannabis Tracking System (CTS)
- Required OMMP processors and OMMP dispensaries to use CTS for inventory and tracking purposes.
- Using CTS as of January 2021 there are:
 - Approximately 450 grow sites
 - 1 dispensary
 - 0 processors
- Allows grow sites with legal access to water to transfer 20 pounds of marijuana to OLCC licensees annually.

OMMP GROW SITES

OLCC INSPECTIONS

- Currently OLCC inspectors inspect OMMP grows that are tracked in the Cannabis Tracking System (CTS), inspecting for both CTS violations as well as violations of OMMP rules.
- OLCC inspectors document their findings, including any violations that they detect, in investigative reports. Violations are shared with OHA, where it is determined whether sanctions are appropriate.
- OLCC and OHA work together to achieve compliance with regulatory requirements through transparency, education, and thorough investigation.

OMMP GROW SITES

OLCC INSPECTIONS OUTCOMES

- In 2020, OLCC medical marijuana inspectors conducted approximately 537 inspections (in person and virtual) and referred 360 violation cases to OHA for review and possible adjudication.
- Due to COVID, OLCC adjusted how we do some inspections in order to protect medical registrants - who may be more medically vulnerable due to an underlying health condition.

OMMP GROW SITES

OLCC VIRTUAL INSPECTIONS - COVID

- In 2020, medical inspectors conducted 358 virtual inspections.
- Virtual inspections have still shown to be effective tools for identifying compliance issues. Of those 358 virtual inspections, 234 of them (65%) revealed at least one compliance issue.
- Virtual inspections may consist of an examination of CTS data, a telephone interview between the inspector and grow site administrator (GSA), the sharing of photos from the grow site, email exchanges between the inspector and GSA, and compliance education, which may include sharing of informational resources or connecting a GSA with our CTS team for technical help

OMMP CARDHOLDER ACCESS

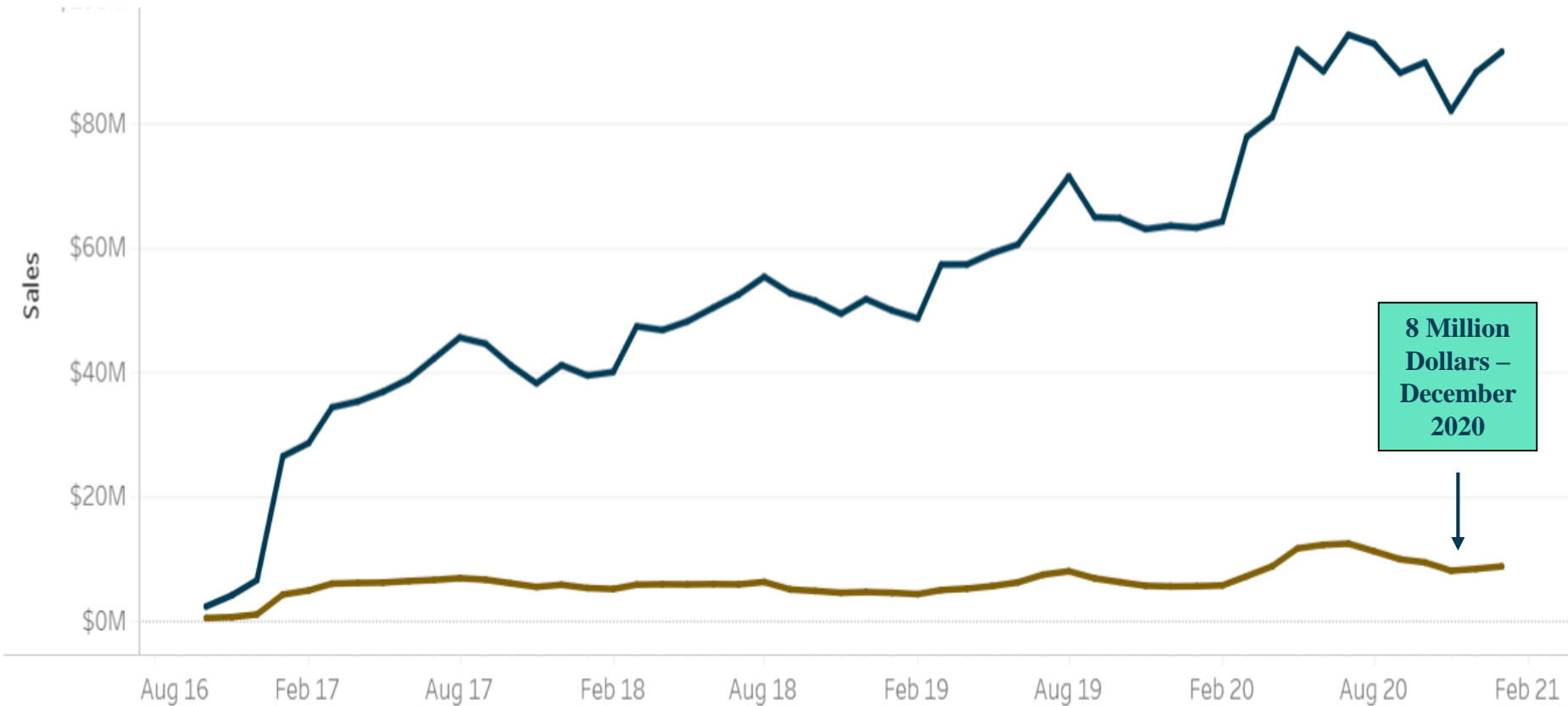
OLCC LICENSED BUSINESSES

- OLCC producers can apply to grow additional canopy area for OMMP cardholders
- OLCC processors can apply to process marijuana directly for cardholders
- OLCC retailers can apply to sell Medical Grade items (items that have more THC than adult use items) at their establishment
- OLCC retailers may apply for approval to deliver outside of their jurisdiction (including opt-out areas) for OMMP cardholders
- OMMP cardholders do not pay point of sale tax on purchases
