

HB 2162 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study potential changes to police officer training and to report results of study to Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021. Takes effect 91 days after adjournment.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Awaiting Amendment--Outline: Replaces measure. Requires all law enforcement agencies to be accredited by July 2023 by an accredited body approved by the DPSST. Adds three public members to Board of Public Safety Standards and Training, including one member who is a person of color or a member of a historically marginalized community. Requires police officers to undergo equity training to maintain licensure. Requires statewide training. Requires DPSST to revoke or suspend an officer's certification upon investigation and finding that officer engaged in policing indicative of bias or discriminatory intent against a protected group, use of excessive or unjustified force, or abuse of lawful authority.

BACKGROUND:

The Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) is responsible for certifying and training public safety personnel in the state of Oregon.

House Bill 2162 is a placeholder measure relating to the Department of Public safety Standards and Training.
