#### GOVERNOR'S CHILD FOSTER CARE ADVISORY COMMISSION

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Governor's Child Foster Care Advisory Commission subject to Senate confirmation.<sup>1</sup>

#### **Appointees**

Alan Linhares of Springfield; Reappointment Jessica Lloyd-Rogers of Reedsport; Reappointment Mamadou Touré of Beaverton; New Appointment

#### **Term**

Linhares: July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2024 Lloyd-Rogers: July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2024 Touré: March 15, 2021 – June 30, 2022

### **Appointment/Confirmation Authority**

ORS 418.041 (2019)

#### Statement of Economic Interest<sup>2</sup>

### Statutory Requirements<sup>3</sup>

The commission consists of 11 members appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate.<sup>4</sup> Members serve four-year terms and at the pleasure of the Governor. Members must be residents of the state with experience and expertise in the foster care system, including but not limited to:<sup>5</sup>

- foster and biological parents and children involved in the foster care system in this state (LINHARES, McNEELY);
- representatives of advocacy organizations that advocate regarding issues pertaining to the foster care system in this state (HIESLER, LLOYD-ROGERS);

- representatives of public, private, profit and nonprofit agencies, organizations and other
  entities with experience in, interest in and responsibility for the provision of care to
  children in the foster care system in this state (DONART, TOURÉ);
- members of the Oregon State Bar with expertise in family and juvenile dependency law (VACANT);
- representatives of law enforcement agencies and district attorneys (VACANT);
- former employees of the Department of Human Services, Oregon Health Authority and Department of Justice who were responsible for the administration and oversight of the child welfare and foster care systems in this state, including but not limited to former caseworkers and former court appointed special advocates (CRUZ);
- representatives of the Judicial Department in consultation with the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court (VACANT); and
- representatives of federally recognized Indian tribes in Oregon and organizations serving Native Americans (CRUZ).

The commission must meet at least once every three months. The members of the commission shall select one member to serve as chairperson and another to serve as vice chairperson, for terms and with duties and powers necessary for the performance of the functions of the offices as the commission determines. A majority of the members of the commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.

# **Duties and Authority**

The commission advises the Governor and the Director of the Department of Human Services regarding the foster care system in this state.<sup>6</sup> The commission must study and report to the Governor and director with respect to:

- legal and policy issues pertaining to the foster care system in this state;
- monitoring accountability in the foster care system by measuring outcomes;
- necessary and recommended improvements to the internal operations of the department;
- recommendations to improve and expand the availability of foster care and, where applicable, to provide alternatives to foster care for children who need care and services:
- promotion of responsible statewide advocacy for children in foster care; and
- ongoing review of foster care providers in this state and the identification of barriers to the provision of quality care and services to children in the foster care system.

The commission must consider reports, findings and recommendations that have been or will be issued by legislative and agency task forces, work groups and committees that have undertaken study, review or oversight of the foster care system in this state.<sup>7</sup>
