



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15 CCRR's in Oregon



The Role of CCRR in Oregon's Early Learning System

- Serve as community experts for child care systems and the Early Learning Workforce
- Promote the health, safety and development of young children in all types of child care settings so that children arrive at school ready to learn
- Recruit, train and coach in order to promote retention of a high quality, diverse Early Learning and Child Care Workforce
- Provide a variety of professional development and continuing education opportunities for the diverse workforce
- Prioritize support for underserved Early Educators specifically those serving families who are on ODHS subsidies
- Work hand in hand with Early Learning Hubs to assess community needs and collaborate on early learning system goals

Child Care Supply Building

- Assisting new child care providers with the start-up process.
- Helping providers meet licensing requirements.
- Offering low-cost or free trainings in topics like health and safety, child development, and sound business practices.
- Working with local and state governments and the private sector to leverage resources for building and maintaining the supply of quality child care.
- Building community awareness and collaborative actions to support operating a child care business

Technical Assistance

• Helping early educators navigate the early learning system

- Emergency Grant Assistance
- Support to become listed with ODHS for subsidies
- Directing or providing access to financial supports for early educators
- Maintaining current data on child care to support child care referral system
- Supported vaccination access to meet the needs of providers especially for BIPOC communities

- Stand Alone Training to meet specific needs and continuing education requirements
