This memo responds to your request for a comparison of two measures relating to the Oregon Medical Marijuana Program (OMMP) currently in the House Committee on General Government.

SUMMARY

House Bill 3197 and House Bill 2265 -1 both change regulatory oversight of the OMMP. Table 1 lists these changes as compared to current regulations on medical and recreational marijuana in the state.
