# SB 441 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Expands roadside memorial signage for veterans killed in action to include those who were formerly designated as either prisoners of war or unaccounted for by the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, with certain requirements, but without the adoption of a concurrent resolution by the Legislative Assembly. Effective 91<sup>st</sup> day after sine die.

Determined to have no fiscal and no revenue impact.

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

#### **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

-1 Includes the adoption of a concurrent resolution by the Legislative Assembly, consistent with existing process requirements for roadside memorials.

# BACKGROUND:

In 2011 the Legislative Assembly established a Roadside Memorial Fund to receive and allocate monies to the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) to erect memorial signs in honor of law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty. In 2013, the Legislative Assembly expanded the program to provide for roadside memorials in honor of fallen members of the Armed Forces. Currently, the Legislative Assembly must adopt a concurrent resolution that recognizes the individual being honored. Between 2016 and 2018, thirty veterans were memorialized in this way.

Senate Bill 441 permits the construction of roadside memorial signs for service members killed in the line of duty who were previously designated as either prisoners of war or unaccounted for by the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency, with certain stipulations, without the adoption of a concurrent resolution by the Legislative Assembly.
