Regarding: Oregon Redistricting, Public Hearing, District 4 – March 16, 2021

Responsibility for redistricting should be vested in an independent special commission, with membership that includes citizens at large, representatives of public interest groups, and members of

minority groups. Redistricting plans should be developed independently of the Legislature.

The delayed US Census presents a challenge. I am glad the Legislature is seeking legal authority to delay

redistricting to allow Census data to be received and utilized. Using any other data source will likely

lead to successful court challenges. However, the Legislature can move ahead with setting up an

independent commission along the lines of that proposed by People Not Politicians (PNP) in 2020 (IP 57)

so that things can move swiftly once the Census data is received.

I am also intrigued by the potential for computerized software as a potent tool to assist in

redistricting. An independent commission could use the time between now and receipt of the data to

review the various software programs available and the parameters that should be considered.

Currently, Roseburg is divided among state House Districts 1, 2, and 7; and between Senate Districts 1 &

4. This makes it very challenging for people to know who their state legislators are, and for a unified

voice from Roseburg to be reflected in the legislature. We are not the only community similarly divided

among several districts. This problem needs to be addressed in redistricting.
