I am against the changing of boundaries for we moved here to get away from Portland. I don't want to see my county become like Portland. I might add that we waive with ALL FIVE FINGERS here, not just the one.

The redistricting will bring big city aspect, which will bring crime, stress on resources like police, fire, higher taxes, and angst to our citizens who feel pride in our county. There is no real upside to changing the boundaries for the people of Columbia County.
