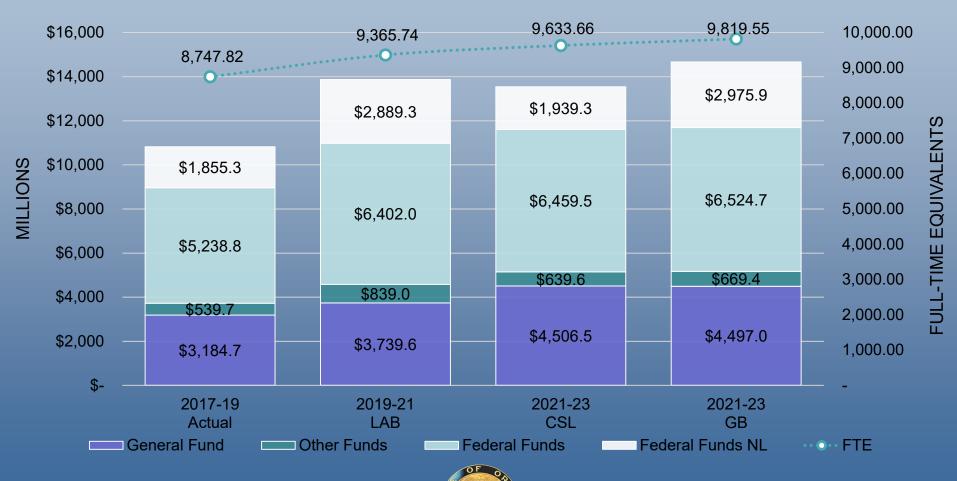
Emerging Issues

- > COVID-19
 - Potential need to extend or adapt COVID-related policy changes
 - Continued impact of COVID on service recipient choices/caseload
 - Sustainability of provider networks
 - Continued impact on economy and public assistance programs
 - Availability of vaccine and take-up rate
- Wildfire Costs
 - Sheltering and food
- Integrated Eligibility System
 - Continued implementation, maintenance & operations

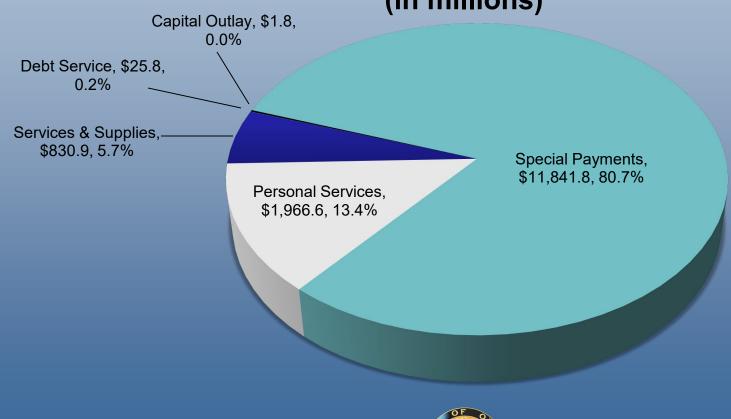

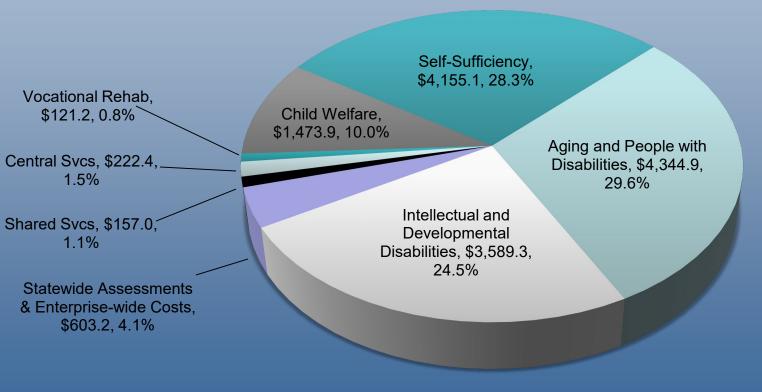

Department of Human Services 2021-23 Governor's Budget Investments

- Focus on equity and racial justice
 - Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Office
 - Refugee assistance
 - Survivor Investor Partnership
- Expands investments in Child Welfare
 - Prevention, Respite Foster Care and training
 - Funding for critical unbudgeted positions
- Integrated Eligibility/ONE maintenance





Department of Human Services 2021-23 Governor's Budget Investments

- Health and safety in long term care settings
 - Infectious Disease Control Specialists
 - Technology Supports and Virtual Visitation
 - Supporting Essential Workers
- Supporting individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities
 - Implementation of new rate model
 - Enhancing wages for direct support professionals
- Maintains current eligibility for Self-Sufficiency





Department of Human Services 2021-23 Governor's Budget Reductions

Program Reductions

- Eliminate targeted vacant positions across agency
- Reduces 32 vacant field staff positions in Aging and People with Disabilities
- Eliminates funding for statewide case management system in Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities
- Fund shift in Vocational Rehabilitation to use Other Funds beginning balance
- Reduced inflation on Services and Supplies accounts and increased Vacancy Savings
- Targeted Services and Supplies reductions
