


Wildfire Debris & Hazard Tree Removal Update


HOUSE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON WILDFIRE RECOVERY





Weekly topline points | from the week of March 15-19

- **157** cleared sites added this week for a total of **629** statewide (out of 2,958 total home sites).
- Hazard tree marking and removal progressing: 52,455 trees marked and 10,971 removed of the more than 290,000 estimated statewide.
- **Fire-impacted corridors continue to be extremely busy** with activity as many different jurisdictions share limited space. Spring Break travel will add to this. We ask everyone to use caution and expect delays.
- Please submit a Right of Entry agreement soon to participate. Submitting now helps crews keep a swift pace and accelerate to future sites. For those not participating, we ask everyone to be aware of the required steps involved.
- **Challenges to note:** planning for daily landfill capacity constraints, steep terrain for hazard tree marking, a phased process for removing debris

As of Friday 3/19/21


- 1,506 properties and 2,958 home sites participating through complete Right of Entry forms (this number fluctuates).
- Number of crews working continues to increase: 77 contractor crews, 60 monitoring crews currently working. Expecting contract crews to reach 82 in next week.




