Onsite Septic Systems in Oregon

- 30% of Oregonians rely on septic system wastewater treatment
- 10-20% of systems fail each year
- Maintenance, Repair and/or Replacement costs can be challenging for many homeowners





Importance of properly functioning systems

- Protect Public Health and Safety
- Protect Groundwater
- Protect Surface Water and Downstream Beneficial Use







Oregon Septic System Repair/Replace Loan Program

- Established by 2016 Legislature
- Grants to support development and administration of low-interest loan programs (*ORS 454.779*)
- \$1.7M in GF grants have resulted in \$3.6M in loans
- Program suspended in 2020 due to lack of funding

 - EWEB Landowner Assistance Program
 - Clackamas SWCD (CWSRF Local Community Loan)
