HB 3361 -1 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Prohibits third-party food platform from arranging delivery or listing the food place on its application or website unless the third-party food platform and food place have a written agreement authorizing the food platform to take orders and make deliveries.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Restaurants' concerns regarding freshness, temperature, appearance, and safety
- Consensus amendment developed by restaurant and technology stakeholders

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-1 Replaces the measure. Prohibits third-party food platform from taking and arranging for delivery of an order from a food place without written consent of the food place.

BACKGROUND:

Third-party food platforms (e.g., DoorDash, Uber Eats, Seamless, Grubhub, and Postmates) provide users with the ability to order and have restaurant meals delivered without contacting the restaurant by phone or through its website. House Bill 3361 requires the food platform to have a written agreement with the restaurant in order to take orders and deliver the restaurant's food and beverages.
