

HB 2611 -3, -4 STAFF MEASURE SUMMARY

WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Specifies that the definition of "agricultural building" for purposes of exempting such structures from the state structural specialty code is limited to a structure used primarily for listed uses. Revises language referencing the federal Flood Insurance Act of 1968 and specifies it is the version of the federal law in effect on the effective date of this Act.

REVENUE: May have revenue impact, but no statement yet issued.

FISCAL: May have fiscal impact, but no statement yet issued.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

-3 Replaces the measure. Allows additional uses of an agricultural building in statute exempting such structures from the state specialty code if the uses: are incidental and accessory to the uses listed in in the statute ; are temporary and personal to the farm owner and the farm owner's immediate family or household; and do not pose a greater hazard to persons or property than the uses listed under the current act.

REVENUE: No revenue impact

FISCAL: Has minimal fiscal impact

-4 Replaces the measure. Allows additional uses of an agricultural building in statute exempting such structures from state specialty code if the uses: are incidental and accessory to the uses listed in the statute ; are personal to the farm owner and the farm owner's immediate family or household; and do not pose a greater hazard to persons or property than the uses listed under the current act.

REVENUE: No revenue impact

FISCAL: Has minimal fiscal impact

BACKGROUND:

ORS 455.315 prevents application of state structural specialty code to certain agricultural buildings being used for specified purposes.

House Bill 2611 would require that an agricultural building be used primarily for the purposes specified in the statute to prevent the application of the state specialty code.
