- **Reforming the Criminal Justice System** Widespread racial disparities persist throughout our criminal justice system. The Governor's budget advances police accountability measures, reforming our courts and stabilizing the Department of Corrections budget going forward.
- Improving Systems to Improve Outcomes To ensure Oregon is rising to the challenge of the moment, our state must rethink how the structural and fundamental parts of our democracy function, by investing in expanded voting access and institutionalizing the Racial Justice Council, improving equity in services by modernizing technology and supporting immigrants and refugees.





Total Recommended Budget of \$26.2 million includes one policy package

- This package funds two positions to support the Racial Justice Council.
  - This package will enable the Governor to address systemic racism in Oregon. These two positions will support the Racial Justice Council, an advisory group to the Governor with subgroups focused on criminal justice reform and police accountability, health equity, economic opportunity, housing and homelessness, environmental equity, and education. The council will provide principles and recommendations that center racial justice and economic recovery to the Governor to inform the 2021-2023 Governor's Recommended Budget and legislative agenda.
