Measure Description:

Changes "Oregon Medical Marijuana Act" to "Oregon Medical and Therapeutic Cannabis Act." Allows person designated to produce marijuana by registry identification cardholder to enter into agreement with registry identification cardholder to transfer marijuana to another registry identification cardholder or primary caregiver.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the Senate Committee on Health Care to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.

The measure modifies various statutes related to medical marijuana. This measure also modifies distributions from the Oregon Marijuana Account, with four percent of funds now dedicated to administration of ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949, which relates to medical marijuana. This is accomplished by reducing the percentage of Oregon Marijuana Account moneys transferred to the State School Fund; mental health treatment or for alcohol and drug abuse prevention, early intervention, and treatment; and the State Police Account.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the Joint Committee on Ways and Means.
