



Oregon Public Universities Serving a More Diverse Student Body






Universities Directly Support Students with Remissions



Population Research Center (PRC)





PRC's Mission is to become a world-class center of training and knowledge for solutions to problems in applied demography, including population estimates, projections, geospatial analysis, and censustaking.

NEW: Oregon Veterinary Diagnostic Lab (OVDL)

Oregon's only public veterinary diagnostic laboratory provides services to partners including the Oregon Health Authority, Department of Fish and Wildlife, the State Veterinarian, the Farm Bureau and the Oregon Zoo.

17,500 animal samples from across the state and beyond tested yearly (nearly 70 per day) for all disease conditions, including those that affect humans like Rabies, E.coli, Salmonella and Leptospira.

>250,000 human COVID-19 samples tested to date. In 2020, OVDL received CLIA certification to assist with Oregon's coronavirus response.

Due to PUSF formula modifications, the GRB recommends shifting UVDL funding from the PUSF into State Programs.

The base funding request for OVDL is \$3,034,323.







With a presence in every county, more than 630 employees and 13,000 volunteers provide practical, research-based information and engage learners, partners, volunteers, and 109,000 youth in communities across Oregon.

Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station

A network of over 400 scientists in 28 academic disciplines at 14 locations strive to improve quality of life, environmental sustainability, and economic development in rural and urban communities.

Oregon Outdoor School

- 2016 Ballot Measure 99 Passes: \$44M in Lottery Funds for up to week of outdoor school
 - Administered by OSU Extension Service
- 2017 Legislature authorizes \$24M program launch
- 2019 Legislature authorized full funding (\$46.8M) anticipated to serve over 40,000 students annually
 - COVID Impact: 43,895 reduced to 13,617 in person programming
 - Over 22,000 additional students served through distance learning (CDL)
 - Expected to serve over 58,000 this year (including 7th graders who missed last year)
 - Launched \$4.5M Equity Diversity and Inclusion Grant Program Program and facility upgrades to ensure equity for all students and full participation

2021-23 Ask – Full Funding (\$48.8M)

Expect recovery to pre-COVID participation, funding for 7th graders who missed programming
