

Weekly topline points | from the week of May 3-7

- We have officially completed the halfway point for participating home sites cleared. +152 cleared sites completed this week for a total of 1,663 statewide (out of 2,824 total home sites).
- **75,955 fire-damaged trees marked and 31,484 removed** of the more than 140,000 estimated statewide. Trees are marked through a series of reviews and quality control measures.

- **Next steps in fire recovery efforts for fire-damaged trees:** independent arborist/forester, internal review, and ensuring an adaptive operation as part of emergency response work.




Environmental Testing Tree Marking Tree Removal Debris Cleanup Complete
