# ALCOHOL DELIVERY AGE VERIFICATION

## CURRENT STATE

### Alcohol Leaving Business

Container includes alcohol label with reminder that recipient must be at least 21 years old

### At the door requirements

Inspect ID to verify recipient is at least 21 years old  
Record Information:  
-Date & time  
-Name of delivery person  
-Name, address and signature\* of recipient  
-FHCs: source of alcohol

### Proof of age verification

Delivering entity must maintain delivery record for 18\* months  
-Provide records to OLCC within 60 days of request

### Enforcement

Complaint-driven enforcement action  
Penalty for delivery to minor:  
-Delivery person: Class A misdemeanor  
-FHC approval may be revoked or suspended  
-Licensee: administrative violation

\*Not enforcing signature requirement during COVID state of emergency, but ID verification still required  
\*Drinks-to-go temporary rule has a shorter record retention requirement (120 days)

# ALCOHOL DELIVERY AGE VERIFICATION PROPOSED FUTURE STATE

Additional elements building on the current framework

## Alcohol Leaving Business

Any person delivering alcohol must complete delivery training prior to delivering alcohol

Alcohol items correctly identified in ecommerce platforms so requirement to check ID is triggered for driver

## At the door requirements

Additional data collection in delivery record:

-Recipient's DOB

## Proof of age verification

Establish process for regular audits of delivery records

Modify record production and retention timelines

## Enforcement

Implement Minor Decoy Operation delivery program

Implement and oversee a Responsible Delivery Program

Model enforcement on the existing store clerk framework
