


PRISON CLOSURES AND LAYOFFS

- Increased education of, and access to, wellness benefits






MANAGING THE AIC POPULATION ACROSS ALL INSTITUTIONS

- Counselor and other institution staff recommendations
- Substance use disorder treatment
- Mental health services
- Medical healthcare needs
- Work opportunities
- Education needs
- Vocational training programs

- Developmental disability assistance
- Gender identity (transgender/ intersex)
- Verified conflicts
- Safety and security concerns
- High-risk placement
- Bed space or other institution needs or circumstances
- County of release



EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS













DEFERRED MAINTENANCE

- Facility and maintenance operating budget and process
- Database to maintain assets and equipment and to prioritize and schedule routine and preventative maintenance
- Faithful and Gould Facility Condition Assessment
- Deferred maintenance funding (general funds)



INSPECTOR GENERAL'S ROLE

- Internal Oversight with policy making authority
 - Differentiate from external oversight (ombudsman)
- Reports to Director as a member of Executive Team
- Evolution: address corruption and risk mitigation
 - Investigation (corruption and mitigation)
 - Hearings (risk mitigation)
 - Security Threat Management and Intel (mitigation)
 - Special Programs (risk mitigation)
 - Research (a different type of investigation)
- Liaison (DOJ, State Police, DA's offices) to partners


- Therapeutic Level of Care (TLC)
