# WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Authorizes selection of members of the Consumer Advisory Council (Council) by existing members, or by a seven-member subcommittee appointed by the Council. Refines Council's advisory duties. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

## **BACKGROUND:**

The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) is advised on substance use disorder and mental health policies by a Consumer Advisory Council (Council) consisting of 15 to 25 members. Current guidelines governing OHA's appointments to the Council require only that OHA strive for a balance of representation across age, race, ethnicity, and geographic areas of the state.

Senate Bill 721 A authorizes existing members of the Consumer Advisory Council to select new members, or to convene a seven-member subcommittee of current members to select new members.
