Summary of Revenue Changes

General Fund supports over 98% of the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA) core operations. The remaining 2% of revenue are Other Funds derived from filing fees, publication sales, and other miscellaneous fees. Filing fees collected from land use appellants and interveners are transferred to the state's General Fund. LUBA estimates the agency will transfer \$138,100 to the General Fund from these fees during the 2021-23 biennium. LUBA introduced House Bill 2110, which proposes to increase the fee to file a notice of intent to appeal a land use decision or limited land use decision from \$200 to \$300. The anticipated new revenue from the fee increase is projected to be \$27,300 per biennium and LUBA expects to collect approximately \$81,900 each biennium. All filing fee revenue is deposited in the General Fund.

Summary of Natural Resources Subcommittee Action

LUBA was established in 1979 by the Oregon Legislature to provide prompt, professional, and efficient resolutions of land use appeals. LUBA has jurisdiction to review appeals of land use decisions made by cities, counties, districts, and state agencies. In this role, LUBA is also responsible for developing a consistent body of land use law. LUBA is required by statute to publish its orders and opinions and make them public for citizens, decision-makers, and participants in land use processes to use as guidance for future land use decision-making. The Subcommittee recommended the following budget note related to the administration of a case management system:

Budget Note

The Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA) is directed to work with the Department of Administrative Services Enterprise Information Services (DAS EIS) to begin the foundational work on an electronic filing and case management system. That

work must comply with State Information Technology Policy requirements and at minimum include business systems analysis, requirements gathering, business case development, and the project management services necessary to complete this work in a timely manner. LUBA and DAS EIS are to jointly report on the progress of this work including funding requirements to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means during the 2022 Legislative session.

The Subcommittee recommended a budget of \$2,556,501 total funds, including \$2,520,015 General Fund, \$36,486 Other Funds expenditure limitation, and seven positions (7.00 FTE). This is a 12% increase from the 2019-21 legislatively approved budget. The Subcommittee recommended the following packages:

<u>Package 087: August 2020 Special Session</u>. This package increases General Fund by \$78,239 to reflect the 2021-23 budgetary impact of transitioning support services from the Department of State Lands over to the Department of Administrative Services during the August 2020 special session.

<u>Package 090: Analyst Adjustment.</u> This package increases General Fund by \$7,037 to correct a technical error in the reclassification of an Executive Support Specialist 2 position.

<u>Package 099: Microsoft 365 Consolidation.</u> Microsoft 365 is being consolidated within the office of the State Information Officer at the E5 level of service. This cost is built into the State Government Service Charge for every agency as a cost increase for the 2021-23 biennium. This package makes a corresponding reduction to the agency base budget in an amount equivalent to what agencies should be paying in the current 2019-21 biennium for Microsoft 365 at the E3 level of service.

<u>Package 101: Compliance Specialist 3 (General Fund).</u> This package establishes a second full-time staff attorney position that will draft orders and opinions for review, research case law, and prepare the appellate court record for transmittal to the Court of Appeals. This position is funded through an increase in General Fund of \$201,818, for one position (1.00 FTE).
