**Subject:** SB 763 – Relating to pharmaceutical representative licensure  
Work Session Recommendations

SB 763 establishes a regulatory program for pharmaceutical representatives and requires representatives to obtain a license from the Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS) if they engage in certain activities with a health care provider for compensation. The measure directs DCBS to set application and renewal fees; establish qualification for licensure; specify duties for licensees and licensee applicants; establish continuing education requirements; and report to Legislative Assembly annually.

This measure includes \$912,143 in Other Funds limitation for DCBS to operate the new program.

### **Recommended Changes**

LFO recommends adoption of the -3 amendment.

### **Final Subcommittee Action**

LFO recommends that SB 763, as amended by the -3 amendment, to be moved to the Ways and Means Full Committee.
