



The figure above shows the spectacular linear increase in standing hardwood and softwood timber in the United States. This figure contains more data points from updated U.S. Forest Service publication. Remarkably, this shows an increase of 60% in 65 years. This is equivalent to an increase of 30 tons of new standing timber for every man, woman, and child in the current U.S. population (approximately 1,000 lbs per year per person)
