SUMMARY

Allows Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine to require person under investigation by board to undergo mental, physical, chemical dependency or competency evaluation.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

OPEN GOVERNMENT IMPACT

Legislative Counsel has not adopted standards for drafting measures that establish exemptions from disclosure of public records.

This measure prohibits public disclosure of the results of a mental, physical, chemical dependency or competency evaluation required by the Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine of a person under investigation by the board.

If those public records that could be subject to public disclosure were instead subject to mandatory disclosure under public records law, the public could receive additional information regarding investigations performed by the Oregon Board of Naturopathic Medicine.
