**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:**

Increases amount of wine that holder of direct shipper permit may send per month to an Oregon resident from two cases to five cases. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Provisions of the measure
- Impact of pandemic on Oregon wineries and increased reliance on online sales

**EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**BACKGROUND:**

Oregon law allows a person who holds a direct shipper permit from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission to sell and ship malt beverages, wine, or cider directly to a resident of this state. The permit holder may send no more than two cases containing no more than nine liters per case to any resident each month.

Senate Bill 406 A increases the amount of wine that a direct shipper permit holder may send each month to a resident to five cases containing no more than nine liters per case. The measure retains the existing monthly shipping limit for malt beverages and cider.
