# WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Eases process for cities to elect to receive state-shared revenues by removing the requirement for an enactment of an ordinance or resolution signaling intent to take election. Adds to statute a definition of "consolidated property taxes" for purposes to cities receiving state-shared revenues. Establishes timeline for the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) to determine the amount of property taxes due to cities. Eliminates obsolete statute references.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Difficulties of sharing state revenues with local jurisdictions
- Issues related to sharing funds with small rural locals including turnover

## **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

Removes from the introduced version of the bill a section that would ease compliance requirements for cities related to state revenue sharing.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Some state revenues are distributed to lower levels of government including cities. This bill clarifies and changes statute related to the process of revenue sharing.
