WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires that motor vehicles must use headlights at all times when the vehicle is being driven on a highway unless the vehicle is equipped with daytime running lights. Designates failure to do so as Class B traffic violation with a maximum fine of \$1,000.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Visibility limited in certain conditions even during daytime hours
- Many businesses require drivers to use headlights when operating vehicles
- Whether daytime running lights would meet measure's requirements

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Specifies that vehicles equipped with daytime running lights are in compliance with measure's requirements.

BACKGROUND:

Under current law, a motor vehicle driver commits the offense of failure to use headlights if driving any vehicle in a funeral procession without using low-beam headlights. Motorcycles and mopeds are required to operate headlights at all times. All states require that vehicles use headlights between sunset and sunrise; some states extend the requirement to one-half hour prior to sunset and one-half hour after sunrise and some states require operation of headlights during rain, snow, or other inclement weather.

Senate Bill 166 A requires all motor vehicles being driven on a highway to have their headlights lighted or be equipped with daytime running lights. Failure to do so is designated a Class B traffic violation.
