## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Creates exceptions to certain privileges in elderly and adult abuse proceedings.

#### **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Alignment with exceptions for admissibility of evidence in child abuse proceedings
- Applies to vulnerable adults
- Elder abuse becoming more common
- Consistent with other privilege exceptions

## **EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:**

No amendment.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Oregon statutes provide limitations on the admissibility of certain evidence based on privilege between the parties involved. Examples of privilege include psychotherapist-patient privilege, the physician-patient, and the spousal privilege.

Senate Bill 176 creates exceptions to certain privileges in proceedings involving allegations or reports of elder or adult abuse.
