### **Measure Description:**

Adds specific requirements to the affirmative defense to unlawfully transporting "private metal property," defined as catalytic converters or components of catalytic converters, which must be present for a person to raise the defense. Expands the definition of "commercial seller" and prohibits a scrap metal business from purchasing or receiving private metal property, except from a commercial seller. Requires a scrap metal business to record certain information related to private metal property purchased or received by the scrap metal business. Restricts the means of payment when a scrap metal business purchases private metal property.
