WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Directs all law enforcement units to participate in the National Use-of-Force Data Collection operated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Directs the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to analyze data from the National Use-of-Force Data Collection operated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and report annually to an appropriate committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly on the analysis.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Public access to reported information
- Identifying law enforcement agencies that do not participate in reporting requirements
- Provisions of measure

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Replaces the measure.

BACKGROUND:

Current reporting requirements relating to use of force by law enforcement is limited to cases involving the use of deadly physical force by officers.

House Bill 2932 A would require law enforcement agencies to provide information to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Use-of-Force Data Collection describing the circumstances and individuals involved when a peace officer or corrections officer uses any type of force or threatens to use physical force against an individual. The Criminal Justice Commission must then analyze the data and report back to the appropriate legislative committee of the Legislative Assembly with its analysis.
