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Measure Description:

Converts mandatory minimum sentences for specified felonies other than murder to presumptive sentences.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Administrative Services (DAS), District Attorneys and their Deputies (DAs), Oregon Judicial Department (OJD), Department of Justice (DOJ), Department of Corrections (DOC), Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision (BPPPS), Criminal Justice Commission (CJC)

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on the Judiciary to the House Committee on Rules.

House Bill 2002 is an omnibus related to sentencing and corrections policies. The measure repeals certain mandatory minimum sentences and converts them to presumptive sentences. The measure amends limitations on prison sentence duration reductions as well as probationary sentences, reduces law enforcement arrest authority, and directs Justice Reinvestment funds to be distributed to culturally specific and responsive service providers. The Oregon Department of Administrative Services would receive a General Fund appropriation of \$2,500,000 under this measure for redistribution to the Northwest Health Foundation for the Reimagine Safety Fund.

A more complete fiscal analysis on the measure will be prepared as the measure is considered in the House Committee on Rules.
