#### **Analysis:**

HB 3089 A-Engrossed appropriates \$15,000,000 to the Housing and Community Services Department (HCSD) for deposit in the Public Drinking Water and Sewer Ratepayer Assistance Fund to provide grants to qualified organizations to distribute water and sewer bill payment assistance to low-income residential households.

HCSD estimates the administrative and operational costs for the Public Drinking Water and Sewer Ratepayer Assistance program to be \$526,820 for the 2021-23 biennium and \$620,850 for the 2023-25 biennium. This estimate reflects the personal services and related services and supplies costs for three permanent full-time positions (one Program Analyst 4 position, one Program Analyst 3 position, and one Accountant 3 position) to oversee the program, including developing rules, coordinating competitive solicitations, reviewing applications, managing grant awards, assisting grantees with program execution, ensuring program compliance, as well as providing technical, accounting, and fiscal support. The positions are assumed to be permanent because recruiting for permanent positions allows HCSD to access a larger applicant pool and retain staff through the duration of the program. In addition, HCSD anticipates administering a new Low-Income Water Assistance Program on behalf of US Treasury. Although, HCSD has not received federal guidance on this program, including the funding level, the agency would work to align programs for administrative efficiencies. Staff costs for the state Public Drinking Water and Sewer Ratepayer Assistance program may be covered by the federal program in the future.
