## WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish by rule format and process for public post-secondary institutions of education to collect data on students who are parents or are acting as a parent or legal guardian. Requires public post-secondary institutions of education to supply data to Higher Education Coordinating Commission. Allows public post-secondary institutions to continue to use existing forms for collecting demographic data from students without updating forms to comply with requirement. Specifies that requirement applies to forms created for 2022-2023 academic year. Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to submit report on summarized data and progress toward compliance to Legislative Assembly. Mandates that changes apply for 2022-2023 academic year. Empowers Higher Education Coordinating Commission to act in preparation for changes to take effect for 2022-2023 academic year.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

According to the U.S. Department of Education, roughly one quarter of undergraduate students nationwide are also raising children. Rates of timely graduation for these student parents tend to be much lower than average. Student parents are also more likely to be women than men, to be older than nonparent students, and to attend community colleges rather than four-year universities.

Senate Bill 564 A requires the collection of data on student parents at Oregon's public colleges and universities.
