WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:

Repeals authority of community corrections program, State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision, or other local supervisory authority to impose or collect a monthly fee to offset costs of supervising a individual's probation, parole, post-prison supervision, or other supervised release. Removes court authority to impose or collect fees for court-ordered supervision or violations of court-ordered supervision. Prohibits State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision from requiring supervised person to pay a fee to victim impact program to offset cost of the person's participation in program.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Many individuals on supervision have fixed incomes
- Enables individuals to focus on payment of restitution and costs of living
- Allocation of state funds to cover gap in funding

EFFECT OF AMENDMENT:

Replaces the measure.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, under Oregon law, a person sentenced to probation or placed by an authority on parole, post-prison supervision, or other form of release, subject to supervision by a community corrections program, is required to pay a monthly fee to offset the costs of supervising the probation, parole, post-prison supervision, or other supervised release (ORS 423.570). Timely payment of the fee is made a condition of such probation, parole, post-prison supervision, or other supervised release.

Senate Bill 620 A repeals the authority of community corrections program, State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision, or other local supervisory authority to impose or collect a monthly fee to offset the costs of supervising a individual's probation, parole, post-prison supervision, or other supervised release. It also removes the court's authority to impose or collect fees for court-ordered supervision or violations of court-ordered supervision.
