Measure Description:

Requires ballots returned by mail to have postal indicator showing ballot was mailed not later than date of election and be received by county clerk not later than seven days after date of election. Provides that if a ballot is returned by mail without a legible postal indicator, the ballot may be counted only if the elector provides evidence sufficient to prove that the ballot was mailed no later than election day.

Analysis:
